WE ARE BELOVED CHILDREN OF GOD

Hot. Humid. July in Pennsylvania isn't for the faint of heart. Without air conditioning in the Church, we were quickly beginning to wilt. (I wonder what the weather was like at the Jordan River the day John baptised Jesus. Of course, John wasn't busy making sure the baby didn't cry or throw up on the three-generation old christening gown!)

Baptism is simple. Water and a short prayer; if I had blinked I would have missed it. (Kind of like Mark's account of Jesus' baptism... just three short verses.) As I held my nephew, the priest pouring the water over his forehead, I tried to savour the sanctity and solemnity of this event. (Did John the Baptist have a similar experience of trying to make time stand still as he baptised Jesus?)

We were a small group. Someone passing through the back of church wouldn't even have noticed us. (Who else was in the Judean countryside that day, curious about this crowd on the banks of the river?) It was the same chapel where my sister and her husband got married and where I go to for daily Mass when I visit. It has a history in our family. (Joshua and the Israelites crossed the Jordan River with the Ark of the Covenant. It's where the Lord cured Naaman of his leprosy when he bathed in its waters)

Then there were the words: "Theodore, the Christian community welcomes you with great joy. In its name I claim you for Christ our Saviour by the sign of his cross." (How must Jesus have felt upon hearing his Father call him 'Beloved'?) And indeed we rejoiced to call Theo, our Beloved, a new member of the Church. Perhaps today you can offer that prayer as a blessing. Call someone by name and bless them. Remind them of their true identity: Beloved Child of God. Then, remind yourself that God loves you and rest in his favour.
