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

Or watch a short explanation of the Resurrection from the Gospel of Luke.






First Reading: Acts 10:34,37-43 **Responsorial Psalm:** Psalm 117(118):1-2,16-17,22-23 **Second Reading:** Colossians 3:1-4 **Gospel: (Choice)** John 20:1-9

"They had failed to understand the teaching of Scripture, that He must rise from the dead"



- In <u>John 20:1-9</u>, who did Jesus appear first to? Why do you think she didn't recognise Him at first?
- Both John and Peter ran to the tomb, and John reached it first, but why do you think he waited for Peter to enter first?
- In <u>Mark 16:1-8</u>, who did the women meet at the tomb? Who were they asked to pass the message to?
- How do you think the apostles felt when they heard the message that Jesus had risen?
- If you were with them that day, what questions would have been in your mind?
- Why do Christians see Holy Week and Easter as the highpoint of the year?
- Why is Sunday a significant day for Christians? Is it significant for you?
- How can you celebrate Easter Sunday, and every Sunday as a sign of Christian faith?



I remember some years ago now visiting a hospital and meeting a patient there who was with his son and daughter. I said hello and we got chatting. It was around Easter. He thanked me for stopping by and said, "I love this time of year. Dying and Resurrection, new life - that's what it's all about." I thought to myself what an example he was to his children in being so open about his faith. And what a thought to ponder! "Dying and Resurrection". How right he was. Nature teaches us this too. Winter turns to Spring. The bare trees become green again. And what about the human person?

With faith we know that we will live with God. Christ has risen from the dead and offers us all hope - sure hope. But without the hope of Easter where would we be? I cannot bear to think. This Holy Week we can appreciate more what the Cross is. We have endured lockdown with all its difficulties. But we can offer all that to Jesus and walk with our crosses with him beside us. No matter what is the worry or the trouble He is greater than it. HE LOVES YOU and ME. Never doubt that.

The only thing that can come between us is our sin. So let us say sorry for our sins and look toward Him with confidence. He has suffered all things and overcome them all and has risen from the dead. As that patient in the hospital said, "Dying and resurrection, new life - that's what it's all about." Lord, help us to believe that more and more and let your love seep into our hearts. Lord by your Cross and Resurrection You have set us free. You are the Saviour of the world.

Can you imagine how joyful their reunion was after the Resurrection?
