

FINDING "MARY MOMENTS"

This Sunday's Gospel tells the story of the Annunciation. The angel Gabriel being sent by God to the virgin Mary in Nazareth to inform her that she was chosen by God to conceive and bear a child who will be named Jesus. The child will be called 'Son of God.'

There are many famous paintings of the Annunciation scene. Artists down through the ages have depicted Mary looking serene and composed, robed in resplendent Renaissance attire, with a glowing halo. However, one artist, Henry Ossawa Tanner, presents us with a different perspective on Mary's experience of the encounter with the divine. He presents Mary sitting on a dishevelled bed and looking utterly dumbfounded and perplexed. There is a hint of confusion in her face as well as anxiety. This is perhaps a more realistic evocation of Mary's response. What God was asking must have been overwhelming for her.

Mary, as a devout lew, would have had a profound awareness of what a "yes" response would mean for her and how costly it might be. Perhaps we have experienced a "Mary Moment" during this awful time of pandemic: a "Mary Moment" when we suddenly realised that there might be a certain shallowness in our lives, that we are called to a way of living that engages us on a deeper level. The pandemic has taught us about the fragility of life, how precious it is, and that we must do all we can to protect one another. We now realise how soul-destroying isolation can be. Maybe, like Mary, we might have experienced a call to respond at a deeper level, to embrace the holiness we desire. Even though we know it will be costly, let us be inspired by Mary's yes.
