Gospel Reflection: Lent: A Time of Cleansing

The great 16th century artist, El Greco, painted at least five versions of today's Gospel in which Jesus drives the money lenders and market traders from the Temple. The painting in the National Gallery Washington (and on the front of this issue!) is titled Christ Cleansing the Temple and is most suitable to this Gospel story in the middle of Lent, so that we can give thought to our need of cleansing before we celebrate Easter.

Each Mass begins with the celebration of the Penitential Rite which allows the congregation to acknowledge their sins along with God's mercy and compassionate forgiveness. What is true throughout the year is given further emphasis in Lent - the Opening Prayer of this Sunday, in which the priest prays "that we, who are bowed down by our conscience" is a recognition that our sin has followed us into the temple of the Lord and is in need of his cleansing in mercy.

The First Reading outlines the code, the Ten Commandments, by which we judge our conscience and provides us with a Lenten guide to living a good life. Trying to live such a guide to holiness makes us dwellers in the new temple that is the Resurrected Christ. Our participation in the Word and at the altar cleanses us, and brings us towards holiness because of contrite hearts which cast out thoughts, words and deeds that are far from holy. Just as Christ cleansed the Temple, the Risen Lord is constantly cleansing our hearts through his love. We must be open to Christ's cleansing zeal within us by living his Commandments in word and deed, so that, we will build a
