When we have joys we yearn to share.


We remember them

SUMMARY of SPECIAL NOVEMBER INDULGENCES for 2020 (applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory) EXTENDED DATES In the Month of November 2020, plenary indulgences under the usual conditions, applicable only the souls in Purgatory, may be gained by the faithful:

- I. Each day between November 1 and 8 or on any 8 (in total) freely chosen individual days in the month of November 2020 by visiting a cemetery.
- II. On November 2 or on any other freely chosen single day in the month of November– by piously visiting a church or a public oratory and reciting there one Our Father and the Apostle's Creed.

His wife, Clodagh, is also a Methodist minister and they have three adult children. Dr Yambasu,who became an Irish citizen in 1989, will lead the church from next June for a year.
