**Pray**In the Gospel today we hear Jesus tell us, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst." The Eucharist is the source and summit of our Catholic faith. Jesus has given us Himself in the gift of Eucharist, the bread of life.

Take a sheet of A4 paper and some colouring pencils or paint. Identify a word or phrase that sticks out to you from this week's Gospel. Write or paint the word or phrase out on your paper and colour it in. As your are colouring, talk with Jesus in your heart about what it means to you. When you are finished hang your artwork on the fridge or on your wall as a reminder of what God is speaking to payourthrough this week's Gospel.

#### Talk

God has shown that He cannot be outdone in generosity and that He will always provide what we need, both materially and spiritually. It is important to stop to count our blessings because we can easily miss all of the wonderful things that God does for us. Discuss the following as a family:

- How is God acting in your life right at this time? In what way(s) do you feel God's presence and providence in your life?
- In what way is God calling you to deeper trust in his providence for your material and spiritual
- Identify some of the gifts that God has given to you and some of your prayers that God has answered
- What are you most thankful to God for?

Pick an evening this week when all of the family can make a visit to the Blessed Sacrament in your local Adoration chapel or Tabernacle. Spend some time in prayer together reading and reflecting on this week's Gospel

#### **EVERY MASS IS A MIRACLE**

We often think that if we could only see or experience a miracle for ourselves it would be easy for us to believe in God and to have strong, unshakable faith. The Gospel this week is a good reminder that this would not necessarily be the case!

Jesus had just performed a miracle before the eyes of the people. Five loaves and two fish were miraculously multiplied to feed 5,000 people. Now, the people are now looking for Jesus but for the wrong reasons. They are looking for him because he was able to give them all the bread they wanted to eat. Their focus was on how Jesus had satisfied their physical, material need for bread to take away their hunger. Even after such a miraculous experience the day before, they remained spiritually blind. Jesus is aware that they are not looking for him because of the signs he worked that revealed he was God. They were unable to recognise Who had provided the bread for them because they had given more value and importance to the bread itself. Jesus wants us to understand that beyond physical hunger we all have a spiritual hunger that cannot be satisfied with normal food and so he tells them "Do not work for food that cannot last, but work for food that endures to eternal life."

The lesson that Jesus teaches us in this week's Gospel is that we must go beyond the gift to discover the Giver. Everything comes from the providential hand of God and is given out of His love for us and His desire to draw us to Himself. He wants us to be drawn as close to Him as we possibly can which is why Jesus has given us the gift of Himself in the Eucharist. At Mass, we must go beyond the gift of bread and wine to discover the reality of what happens at the moment of the consecration. At this moment, we too are witnesses of a miracle when bread and wine are changed into the body and blood of Jesus before our eyes. This is a miracle that happens every time Mass is celebrated when the priest says the words: "This is my body..." and "This is my blood...". Let us make a big effort to be more mindful and attentive to what is happening at Mass and to thank God for the gift of the food that endures to eternal life in the Eucharist.

## Family Prayer

O my God, help me to make a good Communion. Mary, my mother, pray to Jesus for me. All you holy Angels and saints, pray for me. My dear Angel Guardian, lead me to the altar of God.



"Ugh, I don't want to go to Mass - I don't get anything out of it!" Sound familiar? Ever found yourself saying those words?

If we look to Mass for entertainment, more than likely we'll be disappointed... because that's not what Mass is there for.

Fr Mike explains in the video below how we should think in terms of what we give to God at Mass instead of what we get out of Mass. He says that we should give ourselves, and also our very best (bearing in mind that at every Mass God speaks His Word to us, and gives us the Eucharist, Jesus truly present, Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity!). What (or Who) is the best thing ever that we offer up to the Father at every Mass? Jesus Himself.

Taking the focus off ourselves and placing it firmly on Jesus Himself will help our appreciation of the mystery of the Mass.


