Grab your Bible and look up the Gospel reading. In today's Gospel, Jesus healed a deaf man, Don't have one? No worries, you can find this week's readings online here.

Children will enjoy this fun video reflection based on this week's Gospel reading.

Today's first reading from Isaiah speaks to those who are fearful or in need and offers them hope and healing. In their times of need, God's people have a long tradition of asking for and receiving healing. In the Gospel, a crowd brings a deaf man to Jesus and Jesus heals him. Jesus wants to respond to our needs too.

Take some time this week to prayerfully read through the Gospel again. Can you relate to the man who was healed by Jesus? Reflect upon areas of your life in which you need healing or hope. Bring those things to Jesus and tell him about them. Ask him for what you need. Talk to him like you would speak to a friend. Pay attention for how Jesus responds to you. What is he saying or doing? How do you sense him working or moving in your heart? Thank Jesus for the time you spent together.

Talk

allowing the man to hear and to speak. This was a great thing in the deaf man's life! Discuss the following with one another as a family:

- Can you think of a time when God did something wonderful in your life? What happened and did you ever tell anyone about it?
- Can you think of a time when someone you knew was in need and you did something to help meet that need? How might God have been working through you?
- What makes a sacrament different from other prayers and rituals we celebrate? (We believe that Jesus gave us these sacraments and that the grace of God is given to us in a special way through the sacraments.)

Family Challenge! This week make a commitment to perform random

acts of kindness for other people. These small little acts of love can really brighten up another person's day and they allow the love of God to shine through us into the world!



EPHPHATHA

There's a lot going on with that spelling.... and even more going on with the consequence of the word. "Be opened" - and the man's hearing and ability to speak were restored to Him.

Such an unusual miracle, one that even outside of Covid times can make us uncomfortable! We're not used to that level of closeness or intimacy with Jesus. We might even avoid it. Why is that? Are we worried He'll see our flaws and our imperfections? Are we worried, He'll see the real Are we worried, deep-down, that we're imperfect, broken, a failure, unlovable?

Are we deaf to hearing God tell us He loves us because we've filled our ears with messages telling us we're never good enough? Sometimes we're so afraid of what the world thinks, that we're afraid to even speak about our faith. We can find it difficult to affirm and build others up because of our insecurities. We all have a deafness and muteness that need healing.

This week, spend time trying to hear God tell you that you are loved, you are chosen, you are His. See what opportunities He provides for you to build up others too, or speak about Him.

WE ARE A SACRAMENTAL PEOPLE

This week, we continue to hear the Gospel of Mark proclaimed. In the Gospel reading, Jesus heals a man who was deaf and had a speech impediment. This is a story that demonstrates Jesus' healing power, and in it we find some clues about our understanding of the Sacraments. There are seven Sacraments, instituted by Jesus, in the Catholic Church which we are able to receive at different times and stages in our life.

You might be struck by the physical means that Jesus used to heal the man, the use of spittle and touch. Jesus used a natural substance and action to bring about supernatural healing and restoration. Over two thousand years later, the Church continues to celebrate the sacraments using physical means. In the Sacrament of Baptism, for example, the child is baptised with water which the priest pours on their head. In the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, people are anointed with holy oil on their forehead and hands. In the Eucharist, bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ which we then receive. We are a sacramental people who believe that God's grace is given to us through these physical signs.

There is another big clue hidden in this week's Gospel. It is a clue about who Jesus is. The healing of this man points to the fulfilment of Isaiah's prophesy about the coming of God which we read in today's first reading: "Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, and the ears of the deaf unsealed. Then the lame shall leap like a dear and the tongues of the dumb sing for joy."

When Jesus puts his fingers into the man's ears and says "Be opened", he is deliberately fulfilling Isaiah's prophesy which foretold that when God comes the ears of the deaf will be opened. When he touches the man's tongue he is once again deliberately fulfilling the prophesy of Isaiah. Isaiah mentions that the eyes of the blind will also be opened which we have seen Jesus fulfil elsewhere in the Gospels. What is Jesus doing by his actions? He is deliberately doing the miracles Isaiah said God would do. The healing reveals Jesus is the long-awaited Messiah and it also reveals the divinity of Jesus.



Now Read Mark 7:31-37





The deaf and mute man was brought by some friends to Jesus to be healed. Jesus looked at him with compassion and bringing him away from the crowd, looked up to heaven, sighed and said, "Ephphatha" (Be opened) and healed him with a deeply personal touch. Those who saw the miracle were amazed and spread the news. Isaiah 35:4-7 prophesises that when the Messiah comes, "the eyes of the blind shall be opened, the ears of the deaf unsealed, the lame shall leap like deer and the tongues of the dumb sing for joy". They would have been aware of that scripture passage.

Do you believe that Jesus can work miracles in your life? Physical miracles? Spiritual miracles? That He can heal your emotional wounds too, and set you free?

Will you allow yourself to "be opened" this week, to allow Jesus to take you away from the crowd, to look you in the eyes, place his healing hands on your weaknesses and fears, and say "Ephphatha"?

Pray for the grace to want to be open to that transformation!
