MARK 12:28-34

Saints are all so different. Sometimes we can think of them only as cold statues, brightly lit stained glass windows or artistic paintings, and forget that they lived real lives with real struggles just like us. They had families and friends. They laughed and cried. They studied and faced exams. They lived and they loved. Some had to face enormous hardships in their families or from persecutors, some died a martyr's death, some never travelled far from home, some died young. Many didn't seem to achieve much in the eyes of the world. However, the one thing they all had in common was a deep desire to know, love and serve God in everything they did.

Now Read Mark 12:28-34

In this Gospel Passage, Jesus is questioned by a scribe as to which is the greatest commandment of all? Jesus sums up the greatest commandment as loving God with all your heart, mind, soul and strength; and loving your neighbour as yourself. When we think about the lives of the saints, this is exactly what they did.

God was always in first place for them, whether they were single, married or in religious life, a missionary, a mom or dad, a king, a pauper, a doctor, a teacher, a grandparent, a widow, a young student, God was always number one. They never forgot service of others either, and now in heaven, they're still worshipping God and serving us continually!

WHAT IS A SAINT PROTECTOR?

A Patron Saint is a saint to whose protection and intercession a person, a society, a church, or a place is dedicated. Individual people also like to pray to a saint protector, a Saint or blessed they have a personal relationship with and whose intercession and prayers they ask for.

YOU AND YOUR SAINT PROTECTOR

Did you know you can have a saint protector? Some people have a special relationship with a saint throughout their whole lives. It may be the saint whose name they share. It could be the patron saint of something they particularly love (e.g. Sebastian, patron of athletes). Some people choose a new saint each year to learn about, get to know and pray to.

HOW DO I CHOOSE A SAINT PROTECTOR?

There are lots of ways of doing this. Make sure you pray first before deciding or choosing!

- You can be inspired personally in prayer which saint to choose.
- You could ask a holy priest or religious person, or a person of deep faith to pray about this for you and suggest a name to you.
- You can use a patron saint generator on the internet like <u>https://saintsnamegenerator.com/</u>
- You can choose a saint from a list (pull a name out of a hat!)
- You could start with the saint whose name you share: your first name or confirmation name, or whose feast day is on your birthday or the day you were baptised!
- You could choose the patron saint of a particular past time you have, or career you'd like to do, or difficulty that you struggle with.

WHAT DO I DO WHEN I HAVE CHOSEN A SAINT PROTECTOR?

- Research their lives, their struggles, the way they achieved holiness.
- Pray to your saint each day even if you just include, "St _____, pray for me!" at the end of your morning or night prayers.
- Find out their feast day and celebrate it!
- Pray a novena in the 9 days preceding their feast day for a special intention.
- Get an image of the saint: print it out or use it as a wallpaper on your phone.
- Research quotes by or about your saint.
- Watch some good videos about your saint. More than likely you'll find some YouTube content. Has a movie has been made about them?
- Start using a hashtag with your saints name to spread the word on instagram.
- Remember your protector saint is in heaven, looking out for you, rooting for you, cheering you on, loving you and assisting you in whatever way they can. Talk to them as a real friend.

Saints were real people, who faced real challenges, just like us! Just because we call them saints now doesn't mean life was easy for them while they lived on earth. They had to deal with obstacles, with their own limitations and weaknesses, with misunderstanding, hostility, broken relationships. They faced exams, they had to discern what their vocation in life was. Some even endured sickness, or persecution and violence. Their hearts yearned for love, just as ours do. They knew however, that only in God would their hearts be at rest. Once they made God their priority, their daily lives reflected that decision, and they grew in holiness and happiness.

Why not write a letter to your Saint Protector? Maybe you could write about the challenges you face in your life, or the questions his / her story raised for you, or any aspect of his / her story that you found inspiring, or difficult to understand. The important thing is to respond personally and honestly - whatever form that takes for you!



One sunny Sunday, a little boy went to visit his local church with his Mom. He asked question after question about the stained glass windows, because he was so fascinated by the images, and the way the coloured glass reflected striking beams of light on the floor. She explained who each saint depicted in each window was. A few days later in religion class, the teacher asked if anybody knew what a saint was. The excited boy, raising his hand, said "Oh, teacher, I do! A saint is someone that the light shines through!"
