

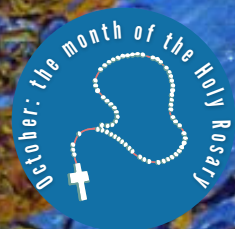

SERVICE AND HUMILITY

Do you believe God can do amazing things in your life? Do you believe He wants to? And that all He requires is faith the size of a mustard seed? Have you ever checked how small that actually is? It's pretty humbling! God often works in little ways and recognises that sometimes that's the only way we can serve too: in small ways. The lives of the saints teach us so much about faith, humility and service. Last week we learned about Padre Pio's incredible humility and obedience, and how he gave his all to God, ministering to others for up to 19 hours a day and always putting God and those who came to him before his own needs. This week we can focus on the little Italian saint, Francis of Assisi. Francis was born to a wealthy, noble life, but an experience with Jesus Christ changed his heart and all he wanted from that point on was to serve God and others. He literally gave away all his wealth, his security and possessions and trusted in God to provide for his every need. His joy, his faith and his radical commitment to the gospel were exactly what was needed at a time in Church history where wealth and power had begun to corrupt the church from within. God's troubadour and his inspiring life and witness helped to rebuild the Church and remind people what a life of service can look like.

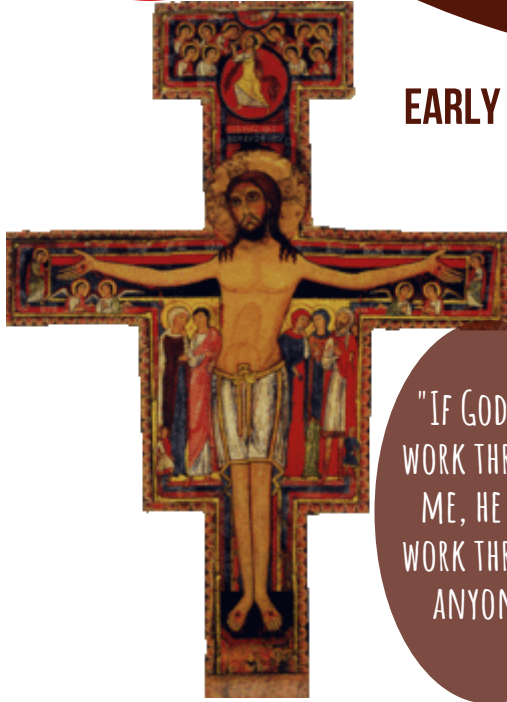

St Francis of Assisi

"START BY DOING WHAT'S NECESSARY; THEN DO WHAT'S POSSIBLE; AND SUDDENLY YOU ARE DOING THE IMPOSSIBLE."



EARLY LIFE

St Francis was born in Assisi, Italy in 1181, the son of a wealthy cloth merchant. Francis grew up in a lifestyle of nobility, wanting for nothing, at least materially. He longed for glory in battle, but was met with capture and disgrace instead.

CONVERSION

A profound encounter with a leper, whose very appearance repulsed him but he felt drawn to embracing, opened his heart to serving the poorest of the poor. Hearing the voice of God speak to him saying "Go rebuild my church, which is falling in ruins", in a dilapidated church from the Cross of San Damiano, Francis initially felt his mission was to physically restore this broken down building. Selling his father's cloth to do so angered his father greatly, but led to Francis renouncing his wealth and inheritance to pursue what he felt God was calling him to do.

HIS MISSION

He later realised his mission was to rebuild the Catholic church which had weakened in faith and been divided by corruption, and he founded the Franciscan Order, still in existence today. Francis received the Stigmata, the wounds of Christ. His fervant love for the poor, for nature and above all for Christ Jesus filled the deepest longings of his heart in a way his material wealth never had.

DEATH AND LEGACY

He died on October 3, 1226 and his feastday is October 4th. His radical life has inspired countless hearts ever since. St Francis is patron saint of animals, ecology, merchants and those suffering from eye disease.

Make the Sign of the Cross

The Apostle's Creed: I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; He descended into hell; on the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there He will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the Communion of Saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

Pray for the Pope's Intentions

Recite one Our Father, three Hail Mary's and a Glory Be.

For each decade:

Pray one Our Father, ten Hail Mary's and one Glory Be.

After each decade: Pray the Fatima Prayer.

Decide which mysteries you will be meditating on.

Announce the mystery before each decade

e.g. "The first Joyful Mystery, The Annunciation"
