

The Award was created to commemorate the late Pope Saint John Paul II who was so committed to young people and who had such belief and confidence in them. The Pope John Paul II Award enables young people in the Diocese of Waterford & Lismore to take an active part in the life of their Church – in the life of their community and society. It enables young people to become more aware of the teaching and role of the Catholic Church in the world, and to engage at a deep level with Christ.

The Award is committed to helping young people enhance their spiritual, physical, emotional and social development through participation in school, Parish, and community activities.

Who is the Award for?

- Anyone from the *age of 16 18* inclusive in 4th, 5th or 6th year, or not in postprimary education.
- The Award is non-competitive, flexible and voluntary and requires an ongoing commitment.

How does it work?

- There are 4 Awards Gold, Silver, Bronze and the Papal Cross.
- Awards are earned by taking part in *Parish Involvement, Social Awareness,* and preparation of a *Reflection*.
- The Papal Cross can only be undertaken by those who have achieved the Gold Award and requires a project rather than a reflection.

EACH AWARD REQUIRES THE FOLLOWING:

Bronze:

- Parish Involvement: 1 hour per week 8 weeks
- Social Awareness: 1 hour per week 8 weeks
- Reflection

Silver:

- Parish Involvement: 1 hour per week 14 weeks
- Social Awareness: 1 hour per week 14 weeks
- Reflection

Gold:

- Parish Involvement: 1 hour per week 20 weeks
- Social Awareness: 1 hour per week 20 weeks
- Reflection

The Papal Cross Award:

- Completion of the Gold Award
- Parish Involvement: 1 hour per week 26 weeks
- Social Awareness: 1 hour per week 26 weeks
- Project

How can I get involved?

• To enrol, complete and sign the application and consent forms. Return the completed forms along with the enrolment fee to your Award leader in your school/parish.
