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VERY BASIC DEFINITIONS:

- Unionists / loyalists believe Northern Ireland should remain a part of the UK and are usually Protestants.
- Nationalists or republicans believe that Northern Ireland should become part of a united Ireland. They are mainly Catholic.

Sr Clare's childhood and teenage years were marked by vicious sectarian violence between Unionists and Nationalists in her native Derry.

The 'Troubles' are widely considered to have begun in her city, with many regarding the 1969 Battle of the Bogside as the beginning of violence on the streets.

Bloody Sunday occurred just ten years before she was born. Twenty-six civil rights protesters were shot by British paratroopers. Thirteen died.

When Sr Clare was a teenager the Good Friday Agreement was signed in 1998. Although this brought peace to Northern Ireland, it has not healed the divisions between Unionists and Nationalists.

GORDON WILSON, 1927 - 1995

On 8 November 1987, during the Enniskillen Remembrance Day Parade, a bomb planted by the Provisional IRA exploded, injuring Wilson and killing his daughter Marie, a nurse. Just hours after the bombing, in an emotional TV interview with the BBC, Gordon Wilson spoke about his final words with Marie as they lay beneath the rubble.

His words, "I bear no ill will. I bear no grudge. Dirty sort of talk is not going to bring her back to life. She was a great wee lassie. She loved her profession. She was a pet. She's dead. She's in heaven and we shall meet again. I will pray for these men tonight and every night." were reported worldwide, becoming among the most-remembered and most poignant quotations from the Troubles.

Wilson went on to become one of Northern Ireland's most respected peace campaigners.



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Christians believe that God has a unique plan for each person, a calling, specifically for each one of us. Another word for a calling is vocation. In the past, people only spoke about vocations when referring to priests or religious, like brothers or nuns. Now we understand that vocation is broader than that. You may have a calling to priesthood or religious life. Or you may be called to married life. You may be called to single life. Maybe you're called to be a doctor, or a teacher, or an engineer, or a salesperson, or an office worker. God's ultimate plan for each one of us is that we become saints, that we are holy and fulfil the maximum of his plan for us here on earth so we can enjoy eternal happiness with Him in Heaven. We achieve this by living out whatever calling God has for each of us, by offering up our lives for His greater glory. If you're called to be a teacher, be the best teacher you can be. If your vocation is to be a mom or dad, be the absolute best parent you can be! If your vocation right now is to be a student, be the best student you can be. God calls some people to priesthood or religious life. This is an amazing life of service to others! The idea can be daunting at first, but remember, whatever God is calling us to, that is His plan for the absolute maximum of our happiness!

Think of how Sr Clare Crockett fulfilled her call to being a religious sister; how she was a spiritual mother to the children she worked with; how she used all her talents to give glory to God and held nothing back; how she loved God with her whole heart and only wanted to serve Him in whatever way she could. Then reflect on how happy this made her! She was fulfilling her vocation, God's plan for her, to the maximum, and nothing could bring her greater joy!



SR CLARE'S ATTITUDE



Sr Clare's motto "All or Nothing" (written here in her own handwriting) certainly summed up her attitude to life. She had no time for mediocrity or hypocrisy. Karolina Vera, Sr. Clare's student at the Playa Prieta school: "Sr. Clare said to me, 'You know that I'm radical: yes or no; everything or nothing; black or white, but not halfway."

This radical attitude was true for her even before she became a Religious Sister.

Fr Rafael saw this trait in Clare before she entered the Servant Sisters of the Home of the Mother. Not living her life in an "all or nothing" way cost Clare in her teenage years. Think about her life when she came home from Spain, getting drunk regularly throughout the week, living a party lifestyle, putting God's plan for her to the back of her mind. She was miserable because she was trying to live a double life. She was not giving her whole heart to God as she knew she was called to. Once she made her relationship with God her number one priority, she was filled with more peace and joy than she could ever have hoped for. As a religious sister, Sr Clare lived everything with a radical totality. She gave God everything, holding nothing back. She put His will and serving others before her own needs and wants, and was a constant source of joy and consolation to those she met, because of the coherent and authentic way she lived.





For Sr. Clare Crockett, music and the guitar were important tools for evangelization, with young people especially, but also within the Home of the Mother community and in any type of missionary work she engaged in. Sr Clare herself loved music, and this song which she heard early in her vocation was a source of great inspiration for her. In fact, it was crucial in her decision to add "the Heart of Mary" to her full religious name.



"THE IRELAND ADVENTURE!"

In 2010, Sr Clare organised a pilgrimage to Ireland with a group of American girls, calling it "The Ireland Adventure!" Sr Clare was anxious that the girls make the most of the pilgrimage and not treat it like a regular holiday. With her typical "all or nothing" attitude she challenged them:

"We're here in Ireland on pilgrimage, which means we're seeking an encounter with God. If you're not willing to live this like a real pilgrimage, it doesn't make sense for you to continue. I can take you to the airport in Dublin tomorrow. If you're not going to take advantage of the graces the Lord wants to give you, go home. I don't want to hear any more complaints. If you decide you want to change your attitude, start by making an effort to meet others and make new friends instead of hanging out with people you already know. Try to pay attention to the needs of others and be the first to serve and help out."

(Sister Clare Crockett: Alone with Christ Alone by Sr Kirsten Gardner, SHM page 232) Although she spoke bluntly, the girls knew how much she cared for them and only wanted what was best for them, so they responded to her challenge and it resulted in a life-changing experience for them. They visited The Rock of Cashel, Holy Cross Abbey, Berrings Mass Rock, Gougane Barra, St Declan's Oratory Ardmore, Mount Melleray Abbey and Grotto, Glendalough, St Patrick's Cathedral (Dublin), Downpatrick, Knock and Croagh Patrick.
