



Can you imagine forgiving the same person seven times?

I don't know about you, but to me that sounds pretty difficult. And yet Jesus tells Peter to be willing to forgive 7 x 70 times!

He doesn't mean we should keep track. Instead He's holding up for us incredibly high standard of the Christian standard: be merciful as your Heavenly Father is merciful.

This is tough, really tough! Is it impossible? By human standards, yes, but by God's grace, thankfully no.

Jesus calls us to love and forgive others as He does if we want to call ourselves a follower of His.

Jesus calls us to give and not count the cost, or as we looked at in Fr Mike's video, to count the cost and still forgive. Lack of forgiveness can enslave us, hold our hearts hostage, eat away at our joy and our ability to love. This is not living life to the full. This is not a path to joy.








Carravagio's famous work, "The Calling of Saint Matthew" illustrates the passage in the Gospel of Matthew (Matthew 9:9), when Jesus invited the tax-collector, Matthew, to follow Him. According to the story Matthew rose and followed him. In the painting, Christ (on the right, behind Peter) points to Matthew, the tax-collector, (the bearded man wearing a beret) - and calls upon him to become the apostle Matthew.
