

In John 15:13 Jesus says: "Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends." How well do you think this statement applies to the life of St Damien of Molokai?

#### Can people still contract leprosy today?

Leprosy (Hansen's Disease) is an infection caused by a slow-growing bacteria (Mycobaterium Leprae) which can affect the nerves, skin, eyes and lining of the nose. In the past leprosy was incurable and so was terribly feared, as the only prospect facing someone diagnosed with leprosy was a slow and painful death, cut off from loved ones and society at large. Nowadays, with early diagnosis and treatment, leprosy can actually be cured. However, if left untreated, the nerve damage can result in crippling of hands and feet, paralysis, and blindness. *(source: https://www.cdc.gov/leprosy/index.html)* 

Leprosy still exists in some parts of Asia, Africa and South America, due to extreme poverty, poor sanitation, malnourishment and stigmatisation which can lead to those suffering from leprosy being afraid to come forward for diagnosis and treatment.

9. What instructions did Jesus give to the man he healed from leprosy (to fulfil the Law of Moses in such a case)?


