



EUCHARISTIC MIRACLE AT LANCIANO



WHAT DO WE MEAN BY "MIRACLE"?

A miracle is a direct intervention by God in the natural order which causes something extraordinary to occur. God's miracles never occur for their own sake, but rather to show us that God is real, to deepen our faith and to help us to see even more how real God's love is. Can you name some miracles that Jesus worked in the Gospels?

TRANSUBSTANTIATION - BIG WORD. EVEN BIGGER REALITY!

What do Catholics believe happens at Mass with the bread and the wine? The "substance" (deepest reality) of bread and wine are changed by the Holy Spirit to the "substance" of Christ's Body and Blood. The "accidents" (appearance or physical attributes) of bread and wine remain. (see CCC 1376) This is known as transubstantiation. What looks like bread and wine is actually, in reality, the Body and Blood of Christ, not a mere symbol, but His full true presence, Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity.

WHAT HAPPENED IN LANCIANO?

Did you know that 135 Eucharistic Miracles from all over the world, right across the centuries, have been investigated and approved by the Catholic Church? The most famous of these miracles occurred at Lanciano, Italy in the 8th century, when a Basilian monk who was beginning to seriously doubt the true presence of Christ in the Eucharist witnessed an incredible transformation in the bread and the wine while celebrating Mass. Not only did the substance change to become the Body and Blood of Christ, but the accidents, the physical appearance changed also.



SCIENTIFIC FINDINGS

Almost thirteen centuries later, the Miraclulous Host and Blood is still preserved in Lanciano, despite being left in their natural state and exposed to the action of atmospheric and biological agents for almost twelve centuries. The most recent investigations occured in 1970-71 and 1981 by experts in the field of anatomy, Pathological Histology, Chemistry and Clinical Microscopy. The reports state:



The Host is real flesh. The Blood is real blood. Both are human in species and the flesh originates from muscular tissue in the heart. The flesh is a "heart" complete in its essential structure e.g. in the flesh we see present in section the myocardium, the endocardium, the vagus nerve and also the left ventricle of the heart. Blood type AB is present in both the flesh and blood. Blood type AB is extremely rare, with approximately 5% of the entire world's population possessing it, and is most predominant in the Middle East. The Blood contains the same proteins in the same normal proportions as fresh blood. One globule of Blood weighed on its own weighs the same as all five globules together (15.85g).

SANTAREM. PORTUGAL - 12TH CENTURY

A woman who believed her husband was cheating on her, in desperation reached out to a sorceress for help. She asked for a consecrated host as payment. The lady hid the host in her veil, but it started bleeding as she left the church. Rushing home she hid it in a trunk, but during the night was awakened by bright lights emanating from the trunk. She confessed everything to her husband, and then to the local priest, who brought the host in procession to the local church. Encased in a miraculous crystal pyx, the host and still liquified blood remain there to this day.



BOLSENA, ITALY - 1263

Fr Peter of Prague, wracked with doubts about the real presence, witnessed blood from the host trickle over his hands and flow to the altar during Mass. The host and corporal were brought to Orvieto and still are on display there today. Pope Urban IV instituted the feast of Corpus Christi one year later, and commissioned St Thomas Aquinas to compose special liturgical texts, including the Tantum Ergo and Panis Angelicus. Blood type AB.



TUMACO, COLOMBIA - 31 JANUARY 1906

As a devastating tidal wave approached the island of Tumaco, parishioners and their priest, Fr Larrondo, walked in procession with the Blessed Sacrament to the seashore, where Fr Larrondo made the sign of the cross with the Eucharist. The wave disappeared before their eyes and water levels returned to normal.



BUENOS AIRES, ARGENTINA - 18 AUGUST 1996

A discarded host at the back of the church was placed in a container of water to dissolve. Days later the host had changed in appearance to a bloodied flesh-like substance, which increased in size. Kept a secret for 3 years, Archbishop Bergoglio (now Pope Francis) commissioned an investigation. New York forensic team, led by Fr Frederic Zugibe did not know the origins of the sample but found that is was real human flesh and blood, blood type AB, heart muscle, and that the "heart had been under severe stress, as if the owner had been beaten severely about the chest."



TIXTLA, MEXICO — 21 OCTOBER 2006

A host which appeared to be bleeding in the pyx during the distribution of Holy Communion was later tested and found to be human heart muscle, with blood type AB. Furthermore, the host was bleeding from the inside, as the wound appeared and acted just as a living wound would, with coagulation on the superior part of the wound, and fresh blood in the underlying interior layers. Blood type AB.



SOKÓŁKA, POLAND - 12 OCTOBER 2008

A discarded host which did not dissolve in water changed in appearance to resemble a blood clot. When tested, it was found to be heart muscle, the person the sample was taken from was shown to be near death, and the remaining host was so tightly interconnected with the fibres of human tissue that it was as if the bread was transforming into flesh. Blood type AB.



LEGNICA, POLAND - 25 DECEMBER 2013

A discarded host which did not dissolve in water changed in appearance to resemble a bloodied flesh. Forensic examination found it was real human tissue of the muscle of the heart, appearing under the strains of agony. Blood type AB.

Paralysed and bedridden by age 21 following a severe fall and irreversible injuries in her teenage years, Alexandrina experienced the 3 hour Passion of Jesus every Friday for 4 years, before receiving her new mission from Jesus Himself: to survive on the Eucharist alone for the last 13 years of her life. Medical tests could not account for her health or survival, but Jesus said to her: "You are living by the Eucharist alone because I want to prove to the world the power of the Eucharist and the power of my life in souls."

VENERABLE MARTHE ROBIN, FRANCE (1902 - 1981)



With a strong draw to prayer from early childhood, but weakened from an early age by typhoid and later painful and debilitating illnesses, Marthe was eventually bedridden through paralysis of her legs and also her digestive tract which left her unable to eat or drink. The only food she could consume was the Eucharistic host, and she survived for the last 51 years of her life on the Eucharist alone, taking no other food or drink. The Eucharist was for her "the one thing that cures, comforts, lifts, blesses, my Everything."

ST TARCISIUS (3RD CENTURY ROME)



12 year old Tarcisius was beaten to death by his peers for being a Christian, when secretly bringing the Eucharist to imprisoned Christians in the Colliseum awaiting death. Tarcisius fought to protect the Eucharist from his attackers to the last of his strength until he fell unconsious. A Roman soldier who was a Christian came on the scene and took Tarcisius to the Catacambs where he died, and was venerated as a martyr.

FR MAURICE KINRECHTIN, CLONMEL D. 1585



Imprisoned in Clonmel jail for a year before a temporary release to spend one evening at Easter at the house of Victor White, a local Catholic, Fr Maurice prepared to celebrate Mass on Easter Sunday morning for Catholics in the area. However the occasion was used to try to ensnare him and others. He escaped with others, but Victor White was imprisoned and sentenced to death for refusing to give up the whereabouts of Fr Maurice. Fr Maurice surrendered himself, having heard of Victor's plight, and was imprisoned and tortured for refusing to give up his faith. Dragged through the streets of Clonmel on a hurdle and hanged, he was taken down half-way through and beheaded, and his head placed on a spike outside the jail as a warning. However, it served rather to instill hope and faith of the locals in the Sacrifice of the Mass instead.

ST MARGARET CLITHEROW, ENGLAND • 1555 - 1586



Well-liked and generously serving, when Margaret was imprisoned for the crime of hiding priests, she refused to compromise her beliefs or her commitment to sheltering priests in secret, despite knowing what fate awaited her. Margaret was crushed to death by heavy weights, with a sharp rock under her back which ensured her back snapped and left her in agonising pain as she waited for death to come from crushing. Her last words were "Jesu, Jesus, have mercy on me."



FR RAGHEED GANNI, 1972 - 2007 (IRAQ)



Fr Ragheed studied in Rome and spent many summers working on the pilgrim island of Lough Derg. After his ordination he returned to his homeland of Mosul, Iraq where the Islamic State were terrorising and murdering Christians. "There are days when I feel frail and full of fear.But when, holding the Eucharist, I say, 'Behold the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world,' I feel His strength in me. When I hold the Host in my hands, it is really He who is holding me and all of us, challenging the terrorists and keeping us all united in His boundless love." Despite threats and demands he refused to leave his people, or close his Church, and on Trinity Sunday 2007 along with three subdeacons he was executed in cold-blood outside his Church. His last words were: "How can I close the House of God?"

FULTON SHEEN AND THE LITTLE CHINESE MARTYR FOR THE EUCHARIST



Archbishop Fulton Sheen spoke of the inspiration behind his TV-mission which reached millions: a little Chinese girl, martyred for the Eucharist in Communist China in the 1950s. Refusing to obey the belligerent commander's order to throw crucifixes and pictures torn down from the school walls into the toilet at the back of the room, she was dragged to the local Church where the troops forced open the tabernacle, threw the ciborium on the ground and trampled on the hosts in an effort to crush the locals' beliefs in what they called "fairytales". After they put the priest on house arrest and stationed a guard at the chapel door, the little girl sneaked in quietly for 32 nights, made a Holy Hour and reverently bowed down received one host on her tongue from the ground each night. On the 33rd night, making a noise as she left, the little girl was discovered and beaten to death with the butt of a rifle. The priest was forced to flee the country and brought the inspirational story of this little girl to the shores of America, where Fulton Sheen was so inspired that he never missed making a Holy Hour each day for 60 years of his priesthood. "The greatest love story of all time is contained in a tiny white Host."


ST JOHN PAUL II



Losing his other at age 8, his brother at age 14 and finally his father at age 21, Karol Woytyla was left alone in the world to face Nazism, and then Communism which he eventually helped to topple. Travelling more than three times the distance of the earth to the sun in his life-time and carrying the Church through decades, John Paul II revealed his secret: "The Eucharist is the secret of my day. It gives strength and meaning to all my activities of service to the Church and to the whole world."

Known to spend vast amounts of time in adoration, efforts were frequently made on visits to keep the Pope from the chapel so as not to derail the schedule, as happened in a Maryland seminary when Fr Tucci ordered all the doors in the corridor to be kept closed, since they were identical and the Pope could pass through without noticing the chapel. However, as Pope John Paul II made his way through the hallway, he stopped outside one closed door, wagged his finger at Fr Tucci and entered the chapel to pray.
