



WHAT WOULD YOU MOST LIKE TO BE REMEMBERED FOR IN THIS LIFE?

WHO WAS ST BERNADETTE?

Bernadette Soubirous was born in Lourdes, France on 7th January 1844. She was the eldest of nine children born to Francois Soubirous and his wife Louise. Francois was a miller. The family (six persons) lived in the *Cachot* (a damp and disused prison cell) in very poor conditions.



Bernadette was a sickly child, suffering from asthma. Because of her poor health she was sent to live in the nearby village of Bartres as a young girl, helping her aunt by looking after the sheep. At the time of the Apparitions in 1858, Bernadette was 14 years old and had just returned to Lourdes to prepare for her first Communion. She was knew only a few prayers and only learned to read and write when she was 16. She was tiny in stature, at just 4' 7"!

The Story of Lourdes

1st Apparition: Thursday 11th February 1858

Bernadette went with her sister, Toinette-Marie (11 years) and a friend, Jeanne (13 years) to collect firewood at Massabielle, a dump near the village. Afraid to follow the other two across the small canal, Bernadette paused, and began to take off her stockings. She heard a gust of wind, but nothing moved. Then she saw a lady at the Grotto nearby.

"I saw a lady dressed in white. She had a white dress girdled with a blue sash, and a yellow rose on each foot, the colour of the chain of her rosary. After that I rubbed my eyes. I thought I must be making a mistake. I put my hand in my pocket and took out my rosary. I tried to make the Sign of the Cross, but I could not lift my hand to my forehead. The vision made the Sign of the Cross. Then my hand trembled, I tried, and was able to sign myself. I said the rosary. The Vision passed her beads through her fingers, but did not move her lips. When I had finished my rosary, the Vision suddenly disappeared."



Bernadette's mother was angry with her when she returned home, thinking she was making up stories.

2nd Apparition: Sunday 14th February

Bernadette's mother was finally persuaded by the children to allow them to revisit the Grotto. This time Bernadette sprinkled Holy Water at the Lady: she smiled in return.

3rd Apparition: Thursday, 18th February

This time the Lady spoke to Benadette in her native dialect Patois and said, "Will you be good enough to come here every day for fifteen days?" She also confided to Bernadette "I do not promise to make you happy in this world, but I will in the next."



4th & 5th Apparitions: Fri 19th & Sat 20th February

Bernadette's mother reluctantly permitted further visits and accompanied her daughter to the Grotto.



On this occasion Bernadette was seen to be in tears. She had been given a message. **"Pray for Sinners."**

7th Apparition: Tuesday 23rd February

Again the Lady appeared and spoke. Bernadette's ecstasy lasted for an hour. The Lady told Bernadette three secrets for herself at this time. Life for Bernadette was far from easy as she was treated with suspicion and mocked openly, even being slapped in the face.

8th Apparition: Wednesday February 24th

On this day Bernadette kissed the ground and turned to the crowd crying out "Penance, penance, penance."

9th Apparition: Thursday February 25th

Bernadette behaved very strangely. The Lady told her, "Go and drink at the spring and wash in it." All Bernadette could find was a small muddy puddle. Three times she scooped up the water and threw it away before she could bring herself to drink it. She washed her face with the mud and ate some of the grass nearby. People thought that she had gone crazy! By the next day however there was a steady flow of water at the point where Bernadette scraped away the ground and many began to report miraculous healings.



Bernadette and her mother were questioned by the local Prosecutor at this time, and threatened with prison. Her parents had much to suffer during her apparitions also.

10th Apparition: Saturday February 27th

This time, Bernadette received a command: "Go tell the priests to build a chapel here." At the Presbytery, later, she gave the message to the Parish Priest, Abbe Peyramale. He replied that he must know the name of the Lady. Although gruff with Bernadette now, he later became a great friend.



11th & 12th Apparition: February 28th & March 1st

The Lady appeared but gave no message.

13th Apparition: Tuesday March 2nd

The Lady gave another message for the priests: "Go and tell the priests to build a chapel here, and to come in procession." Poor Bernadette had to visit the Presbytery again; and once more Abbe Peyramale asked for the Lady's identity, and for more exact information. If he knew it was Our Lady he would build the chapel.

14th Apparition: Wednesday March 3rd

There was no apparition in the morning, but later in the afternoon the Lady came.

15th Apparition: Thursday March 4th

This time there was no further message, although it was the final day of the promised fifteen days.

16th Apparition: Thursday March 25th



This time Bernadette felt a strong urge to ask the Lady her name, which she did four times. The Lady speaking in Patois said. "I am the Immaculate Conception." Bernadette had no idea what the words Our Lady had spoken to her meant, she just repeated the sounds to herself all the way to his house so she would not forget them.

When she told the priest, he turned pale. This was the sign he had looked for. She had no way of knowing that this was the dogma proclaimed by Pope Pius IX four years previously. He knew Bernadette was truly seeing Our Lady at the grotto, and all in the village believed her too now.

17th Apparition: Wednesday April 7th

There was no message but while she was in ecstasy, the atheist Doctor Dozous, who had previously examined Bernadette, held a candle flame to her fingers for fifteen minutes without any trace of burn.

18th Apparition: Friday July 16th

Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. Our Lady appeared for the last time even though the Grotto had been barricaded by the authorities.



After the apparitions...

When the apparitions ended Bernadette was hounded by the public and by officials for two years until she left Lourdes to live in a hospice of the Sisters of Nevers. In 1866, at the age of 22, she entered the Sisters' convent in the town of Nevers, half way across France, taking the name Sr Marie Bernard. She never returned to Lourdes or the Grotto.

The end of Bernadette's life...





She became a saint, not because she saw Our Lady at the Grotto, but because she showed heroic holiness. She was often treated with suspicion and harshness by her superiors at Nevers and still had to deal with the curiosity of the public. But she bore all this suffering heroically, always remembering how Our Lady of Lourdes had promised her: "I do not promise to make you happy in this world, but in the next".

It was during the last three years of her life that her holiness became obvious to all. In October 1875, her health had finally collapsed, and she was confined to bed for the remaining three years. A tubercular condition in the right knee combined with asthma made those years a continual agony but Bernadette never complained. It is an interesting point that although many people were cured or had their conditions eased at Lourdes, Bernadette herself always had poor health and suffered terribly during her final years.

She died on April 16th 1879 at the age of 35. Bernadette Soubirous was declared Blessed in 1925 and a Saint in 1933.

Another miracle...

Bernadette's body was buried in the small chapel dedicated to St. Joseph, within the convent grounds. In September of 1909, Bernadette's body was exhumed, as part of the process leading to her eventual canonisation.



The tomb was extremely humid - her habit was very damp and the rosary held in her hands was rusted. Yet despite this, the body itself was perfectly preserved, even the iris of her eyes was still a brilliant blue. Two further exhumations (in April 1919 and April 1925) were carried out. At the third, the skin was found to have discoloured slightly in places, due probably to exposure to the air following the forty-six years of burial. Bernadette's body is still incorrupt and can be seen today at Nevers.

Saints were real people, who faced real challenges, just like us! Just because we call them saints now doesn't mean life was easy for them while they lived on earth. They had to deal with obstacles, with their own limitations and weaknesses, with misunderstanding, hostility, broken relationships. They faced exams, they had to discern what their vocation in life was. Some even endured sickness, or persecution and violence. Their hearts yearned for love, just as ours do. They knew however, that only in God would their hearts be at rest. Once they made God their priority, their daily lives reflected that decision, and they grew in holiness and happiness.

Why not write a letter to St Bernadette? Maybe you could write about the challenges you face in your life, or the questions her story raised for you, or any aspect of her story that you found inspiring, or difficult to understand. The important thing is to respond personally and honestly - whatever form that takes for you!





One sunny Sunday, a little boy went to visit his local church with his Mom. He asked question after question about the stained glass windows, because he was so fascinated by the images, and the way the coloured glass reflected striking beams of light on the floor. She explained who each saint depicted in each window was. A few days later in religion class, the teacher asked if anybody knew what a saint was. The excited boy, raising his hand, said "Oh, teacher, I do! A saint is someone that the light shines through!"



ROSARY: Bernadette loved to pray the rosary, and always prayed it during Our Lady's apparitions. Our Lady appeared carrying a rosary beads on her right arm. Try to start praying even one decade a day. You can also join in with a live rosary from Lourdes Grotto daily on the Sanctuaire Notre-Dame de Lourdes YouTube Channel.





OUR LADY: Bernadette famously said "I can't find any Madonna beautiful after seeing the original." We can't all have apparitions of Our Lady, so try to find an image of Our Lady that particularly strikes you. Can you print it or save it on your phone? Turn to Our Lady when you feel sick, or frustrated or alone.

HER RELICS: Listen to other young people who were inspired by visiting <u>St Bernadette's Relics</u> on the StBernadetteUK YouTube Channel.



STAND FIRM IN YOUR FAITH! Bernadette never wavered from telling the truth about Our Lady and the apparitions despite the pressure she was under from authorities and her own villagers.

SIGN OF THE CROSS: The other sisters noticed how prayerfully Bernadette made the sign of the cross when she prayed. She had learned this from Our Lady. When next you bless yourself, do it intentionally and prayerfully, mindful of the gift of being a Child of God and



asking His blessing on your life! Remember to bless yourself passing a church, before your meals, passing a graveyard or when you hear an ambulance siren. These are all simple ways of calling down God's blessing on a situation.



PILGRIMAGE: Consider visiting Lourdes some day as a helper or a pilgrim! Maybe your school / parish / diocese are organising a pilgrimage soon. In the meantime, you can watch a livestream from Lourdes on the Sanctuaire Notre-Dame de Lourdes YouTube Channel. You could also visit the shrine at Knock Co. Mayo and learn about Our Lady's apparition there!

LOCAL GROTTO: Parishes and locals have been building Lourdes Grottos for decades in Ireland. Some neighbourhoods even have them. Keep an eye out for a grotto on your travels, and remember to bless yourself passing!



LIGHTING CANDLES at Lourdes has been a tradition since the time of the apparitions. Develop a practice of lighting a candle in church for your intentions and spending a few minutes kneeling in prayer each time.

Pray a **NOVENA** to St Bernadette for a special intention! She knows what it is to struggle as a teenager so she'll love to help and pray for you and with you!

WAKK 7:1-8,14-15,21-23

Jesus was challenged by the Scribes and the Pharisees in this passage because some of His disciples did not perform the Jewish ritual required to clean their hands to the elbow before eating. Jesus is critical of the Pharisees for putting human tradition above God's Law because the tradition of the elders, the teachings of the Pharisees, extended the ritual-purity laws of Temple worship to everyday Jewish life. Jesus criticizes the Pharisees for making this tradition equal to and as binding as the Law of Moses. Their priorities were all wrong. The Pharisees were more concerned about the superficial appearance of being religious, rather than actually striving for personal holiness and true obedience to God's will. Jesus often challenged them about this. He challenges us too.

We each have a choice to make: we can ignore what God calls us to in His Commandments, and the decisions we know He wants us to make, **or** we can really look into our hearts and see what needs to be rooted out to make room for Him there. Jesus is pretty blunt about those habits / sins in Mark 7:21-23 that are damaging to our souls, and those around us.

Fr Mike explains our two choices like this: We can say "here's why I'm the exception to that commandment" or we can say, "Thy will be done."

IF POSSIBLE, GO TO RECEIVE THE SACRAMENT OF CONFESSION TOO, AND LEAVE ALL THOSE THINGS WITH THE LORD, AND MAKE A FRESH START, WITH HIS GRACE TO SUPPORT YOU!







Lord, you offer me so much, and all I have to do is hear your voice and act on it. Help me to make a spiritual makeover this week; to root out anything that prevents me from becoming the best version of myself, a Game-Changer in this world. - Eye-witnesses do not always see the full events or details they might only have seen the start / end of the incident , or maybe just the aftermath. They may even only have heard something from someone else, rather than seeing it with their own eyes. They may not be totally reliable!



Bonus ideas:

- Watch a short news clip on YouTube to become familiar with the running order / type of language used.
- Perform the sketch for the rest of the class!
- Try using a news channel music intro / outtro to give it an authentic feel.
- Maybe you can use images / powerpoint / video to add to the authenticity.
- Maybe you could have a "camera-man" to record the clip, and an editing team to piece it together afterwards.
- Go all out and wear costumes for the report!




