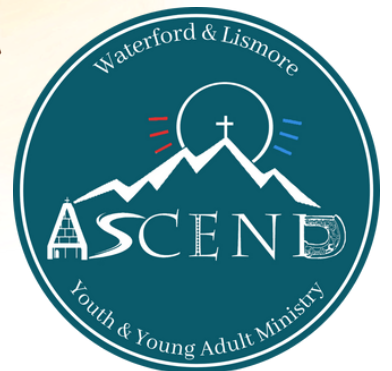

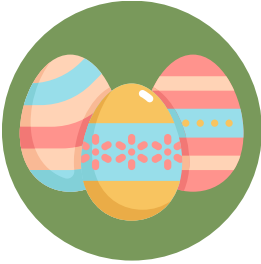

Easter Symbols

CHECK OUT THE MEANING OF THE FOLLOWING EASTER SYMBOLS:

Eggs



Easter eggs are said to represent Jesus' emergence from the tomb and resurrection.

So when you're tucking into your first, or fifth chocolate egg on Easter Sunday, think of what that empty tomb means:

That you have a God who loves you so much, He was willing to suffer, die and rise again from the dead just for you! He conquered sin and death, for our sakes! Now, that's sweeter than any chocolate!

Lilies



White Easter Lilies symbolise Christ's purity and are often used to decorate churches and homes at Easter time.

Lilies grow from dormant bulbs in the ground to flowers which symbolise the rebirth and hope of Christ's resurrection.

Bunnies!



Not much to be honest! At least, not with any real Christian understanding of Easter! Rabbits are associated with fertility (because they have so many baby bunnies in Springtime!). For Christians, at most, the rabbit can symbolise new life and rebirth.

Butterflies



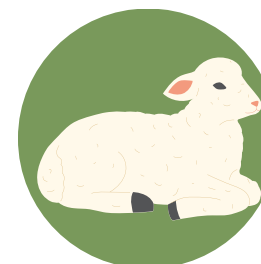
The whole life cycle of a butterfly can be seen as a symbol for the life of Jesus Christ.

The first stage, the caterpillar, can stand for His earthly life.

The cocoon stage can be seen to symbolise Jesus' crucifixion and burial.

The final stage is the butterfly, representing His resurrection from the dead in a glorified body.

Lambs



Of all the Easter symbols, the lamb is probably the most strongly Christian. The lamb comes from the Jewish Passover, where each family killed a lamb as a sacrifice for the Passover meal. When Jesus Christ became the Passover Lamb for everyone, the sacrificial offering for the sake of the whole world, the lamb became a symbol for His sacrifice. Many Christians today also serve lamb as part of the Easter feast. In Germany, there is a tradition to serve an Osterlammkuchen (a cake in the shape of a lamb) on Easter Sunday.

EASTER SYMBOLS

Light

The Paschal Candle

The candle symbolises the Light of Christ and the resurrection - all the other candles in the Church are lit from this one: Jesus is the source of all light!

Beeswax

"...extracted by bees from flowers symbolises the pure flesh of Christ received from His Virgin Mother, the wick signifies the soul of Christ and the flame represents His divinity". (Catholic Encyclopedia)

Flame

Reminds us of the "pillar of fire" that led the Hebrews as they escaped slavery at the hands of the Egyptians.

Cross

The greatest symbol of Jesus since it was through the Cross He chose to save us.

Greek letters Alpha and Omega:

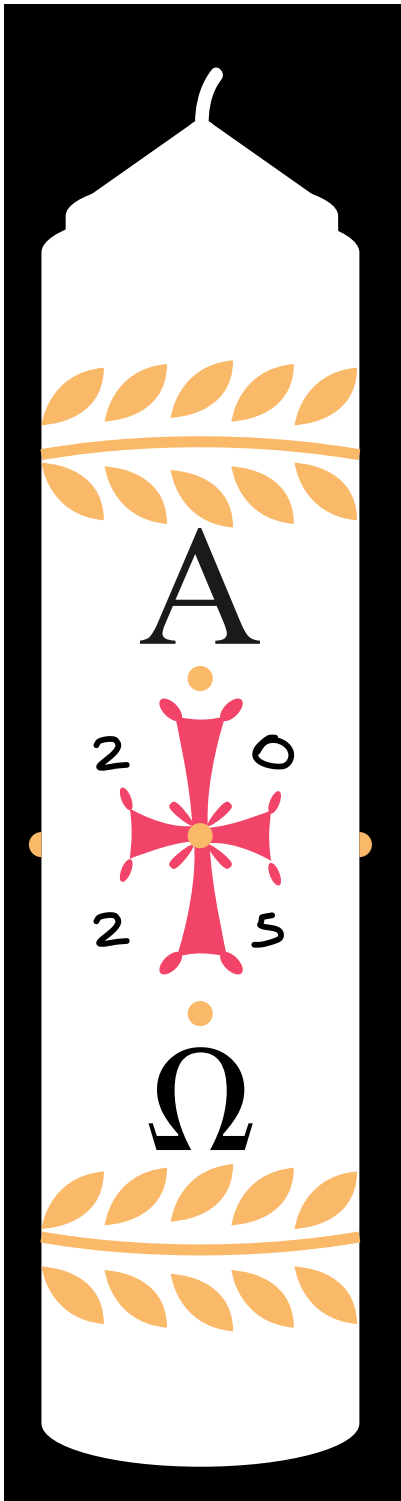

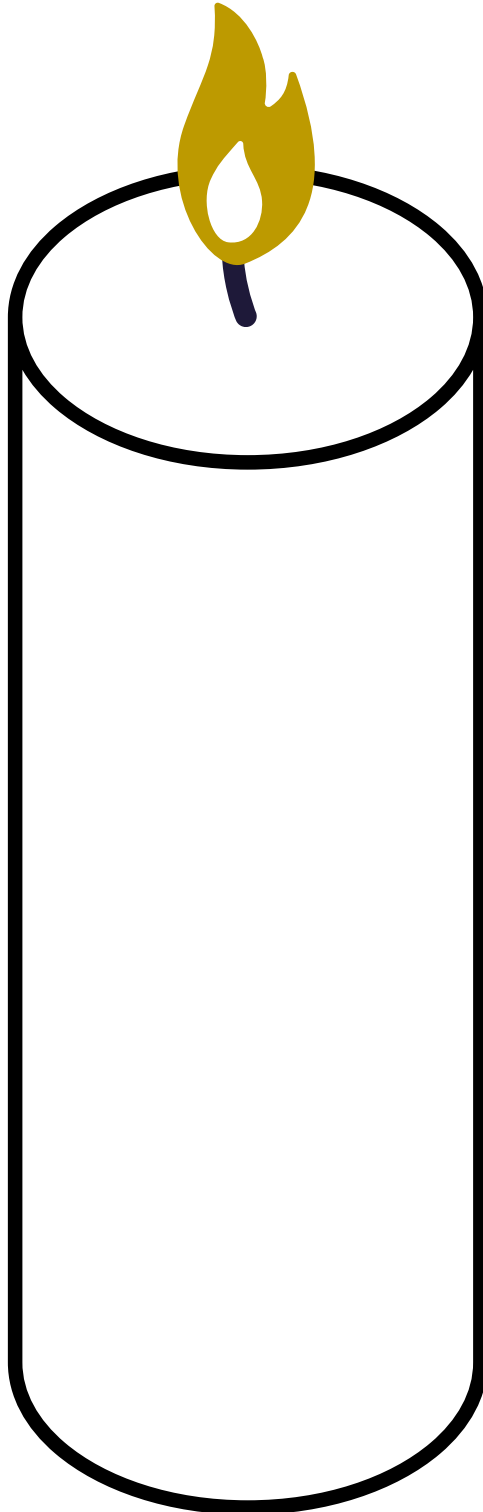

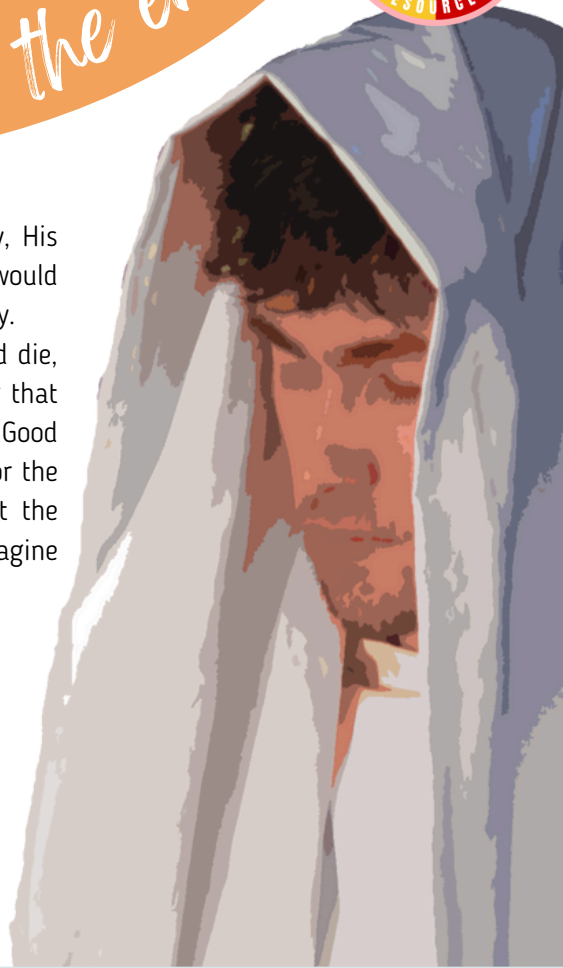


Good Friday was not the end



WHAT IS HOPE?

If Jesus had just been an innocent man who was put to death on Good Friday, His death would have been tragic and an act of senseless cruelty, and the story would have ended there. For Christians, however, Good Friday is not the end of the story. Jesus told his followers on numerous occasions that He would have to suffer and die, but on the third day He would rise again. They were incapable of understanding that at the time. Imagine the pain, grief and hopelessness they must have felt on Good Friday, watching their good friend suffer and die, and with Him all their hopes for the future? Then imagine their overwhelming joy and sense of hope they felt at the resurrection! His mother, Mary, never lost hope in Jesus' promises. Can you imagine how joyful their reunion was after the Resurrection?

WHO WAS ST FAUSTINA?

Saint Maria Faustina was born in a village in Poland in 1905. Her birth name was Helena Kowalska. Her family was poor but prayerful and she only had a basic education. As a child Helena was very devoted to Jesus and felt a call to be a nun, but in her teenage years she became distracted with friends and social life. One night things changed forever for her when Jesus appeared to her, covered in wounds, while she was at a dance with her friends and asked, "How long will you put me off?" She left immediately and after some difficulty finally was accepted by the Congregation of Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy in Warsaw, Poland. Her health was never strong and she performed the humblest tasks in the convent, usually in the kitchen or garden. However, she received extraordinary messages from Jesus. Jesus asked Sr. Faustina to record these experiences, which she compiled into notebooks. These notebooks are known today as the Diary of Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska (Divine Mercy in my Soul).

WHAT IS THE MESSAGE OF DIVINE MERCY?

The message of The Divine Mercy is simple: God loves us and He wants us to truly know that His mercy is greater than our sins, so that we will call upon Him with trust, receive His mercy, and let it flow through us to others. "The greater the sinner, the greater the right he has to My mercy." (723) Use ABC to help you remember the message!

Ask for His Mercy. God wants us to be sorry for our sins and ask Him to pour His mercy out on us and upon the whole world.

Be merciful. God wants us to receive His mercy and in turn be merciful to other.

Completely trust in Jesus. "The more a soul trusts, the more it will receive." (1578)

WHAT DOES THE IMAGE MEAN?

In 1931, our Lord appeared to St. Faustina in a vision. She saw Jesus clothed in a white garment with His right hand raised in blessing. His left hand was touching His garment in the area of the Heart, from where two large rays came forth, one red and the other pale. He asked that an image would be painted of this, with the signature: "Jesus I trust in You" at the bottom, calling it a vessel He was offering people with which they are to keep coming for graces to the fountain of mercy. He said: "The two rays denote Blood and Water. The pale ray stands for the Water which makes souls righteous. The red ray stands for the Blood which is the life of souls." We can think of the blue ray as representing baptism and reconciliation, washing our souls clean, and the red ray as the Eucharist which is our spiritual nourishment.

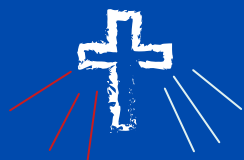
WHEN IS DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY?

Divine Mercy Sunday is celebrated on the Second Sunday of Easter. This day was instituted and promoted by Saint Pope John Paul II beginning on April 30, 2000. St. Faustina was also canonised on April 30, 2000.

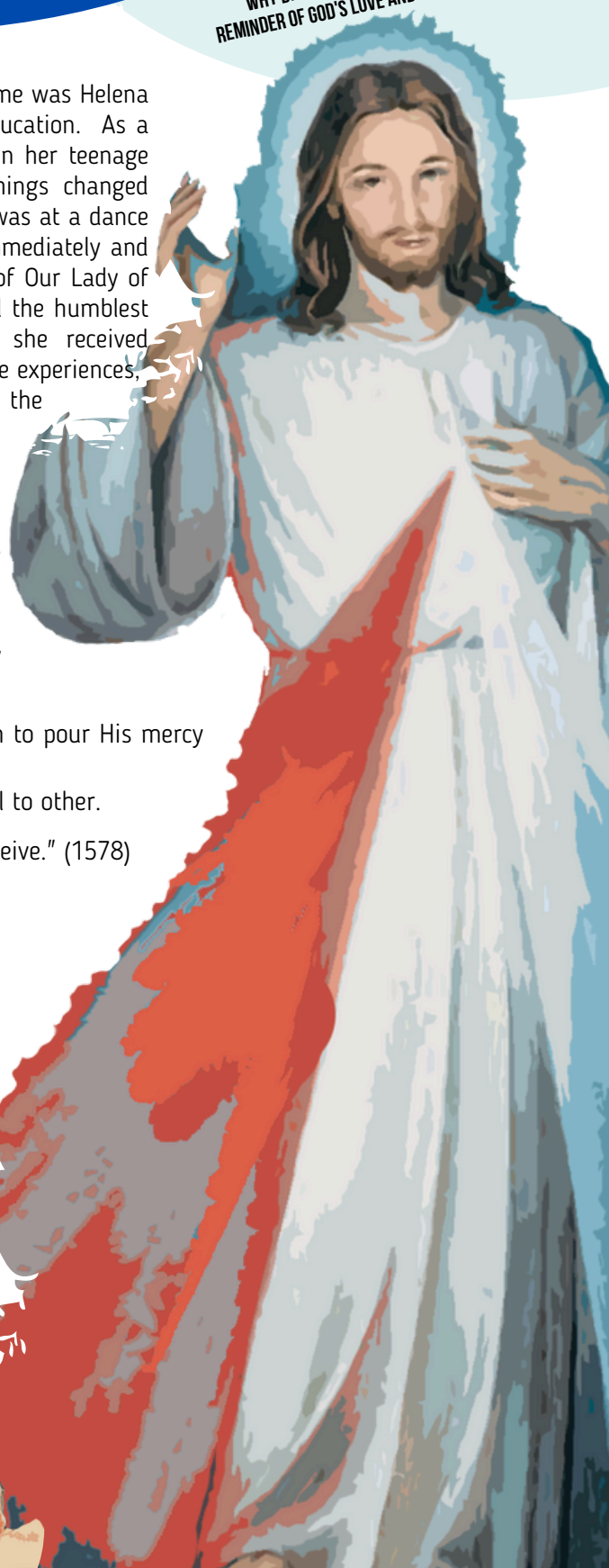

HOW DO I PRAY THE DIVINE MERCY CHAPLET?

Make the Sign of the Cross: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

You expired, Jesus, but the source of life gushed forth for souls, and the ocean of mercy opened up for the whole world. O Fount of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, envelop the whole world and empty Yourself out upon us.

O Blood and Water, which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fountain of Mercy for us, I trust in You! (x3)



Our Father, Who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name; Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil, Amen.

Hail Mary, full of grace. The Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou amongst women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death, Amen.

The Apostle's Creed: I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; He descended into hell; on the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there He will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

- On each of the Our Father beads:

Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your Dearly Beloved Son, Our Lord, Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

- On the Ten Small Beads:


For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.


Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world. (x3)

Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless and the treasury of compassion – inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase Your mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great confidence submit ourselves to Your holy will, which is Love and Mercy itself.

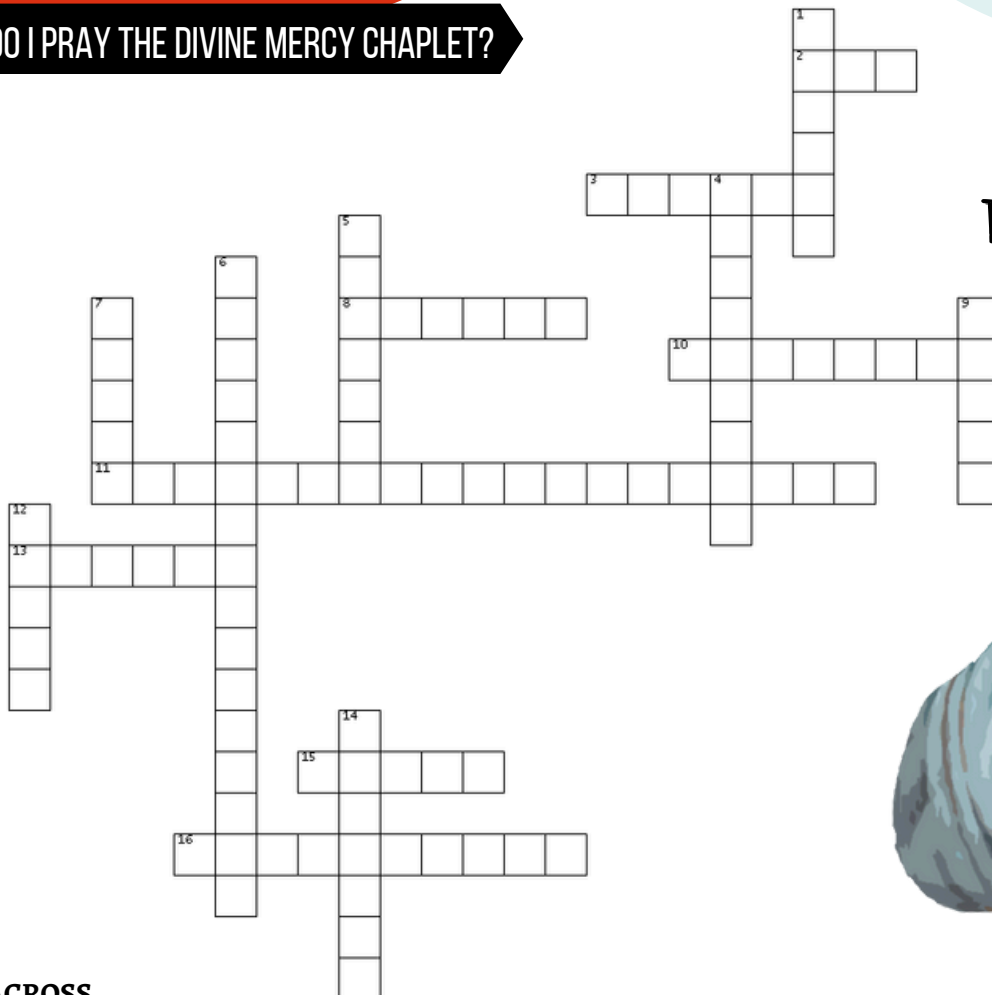

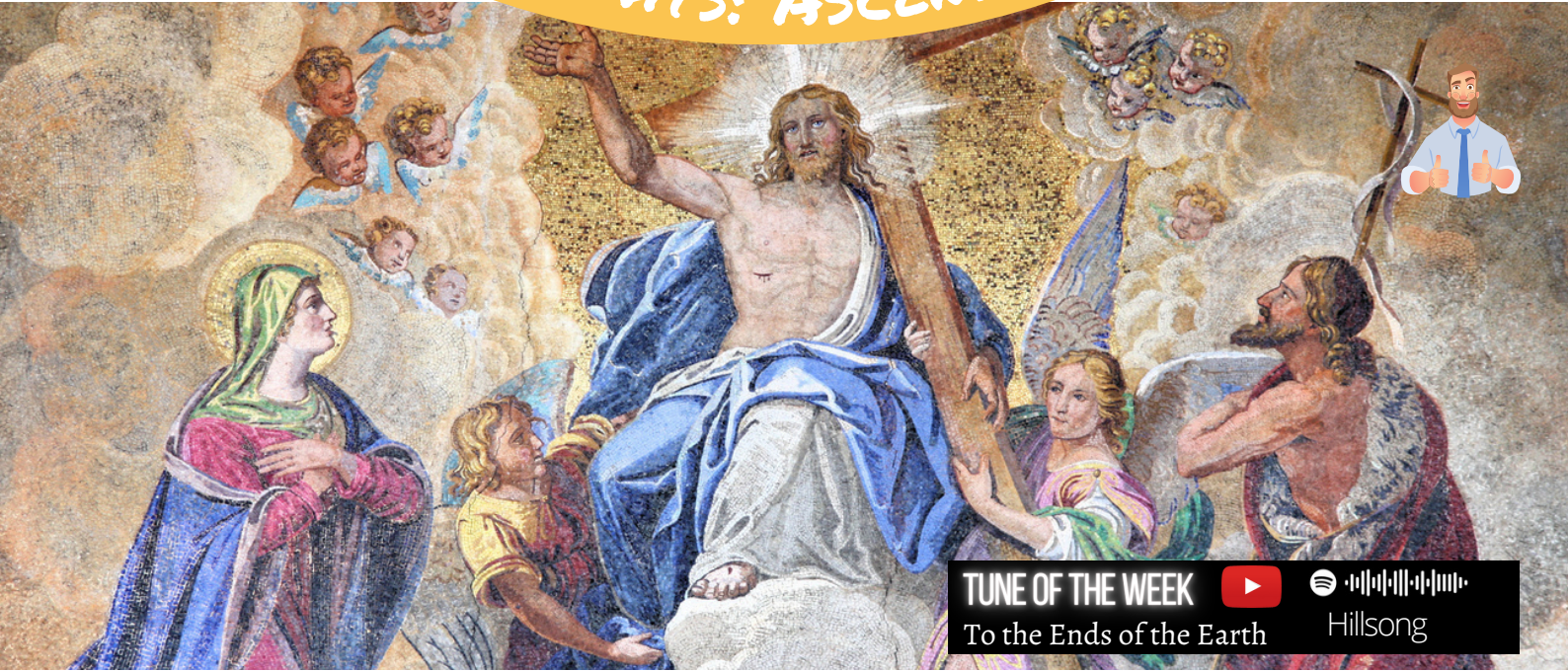
