


Imagine being Bartimaeus in today's Gospel: blind, outcast, in a seemingly hopeless situation. You hear that Jesus of Nazareth is passing by. You know what He is capable of. Of course you cry out to Him for help.

Jesus saw the depth of His faith, and moved by His infinite compassion, He healed Bartimaeus and restored his sight.

Sometimes we can be blind. spiritually, emotionally intellectually. Sometimes we can feel outcast or alone. Do have Bartimaeus' faith and trust in Jesus? Are we willing to make an effort to really effect change in our lives? When we pray, do we really cry out, do we really pray actually expecting results, or do we assume nothing will really change anyway?

God won't always answer our prayers in the way we might like, but He will always answer them. We can be certain of this. We should pray with an expectant faith, faith in a God who knows us, loves us and only wants what is best for us.



In this Gospel Passage, we hear about a well-known miracle of Jesus, when He healed the blind beggar, Bartimaeus and restored his sight. Bartimaeus knew Jesus could help him, and so he didn't stay quiet when the crowd tried to hush him, but called out louder, "Jesus, **Son of David**, have pity on me!" (FYI: This was also a title for the expected Messiah!)

Jesus saw the depth of His faith, and moved by His infinite compassion, He healed Bartimaeus and restored his sight. Do we have this kind of confidence and trust in Jesus? When we pray, do we pray expecting results, or do we assume nothing will really change anyway? God won't always answer our prayers in the way we might like, but He will always answer them. We can be certain of this.
