### WEEKLY CHALLENGE:

Take note this week of how often you are tempted to complain. Do you find yourself complaining about things that aren't even that important? Has it become a habit? Try for a whole day not to complain about anything. Instead say a silent prayer offering up the inconvenience, or asking God to bless those who annoy you! Say something positive and affirming instead!



## HIS WORD & MY LIFE:



This Gospel passage tells the familiar story of the Sermon on the Plain (or in Matthew's Gospel, the Mount), or part of it anyway, the part we refer to as the Beatitudes.

If Jesus was running a modern day marketing campaign for the Church, people would think He was crazy! Happy are the meek, the persecuted, those who mourn, those who hunger... really? That just doesn't make sense, or at least not by the world's standards.

Jesus knows our happiness cannot be based on the circumstances we find ourselves in, or our achievements or power or wealth: all these things are fickle and fleeting.

True joy is based on the sure knowledge that we are created and loved by God, and no matter what life may throw at us, from bad weather, difficult exams, strained friendships, match losses, breakups, sickness and even death, we know that nothing can separate us from the love of Christ.
