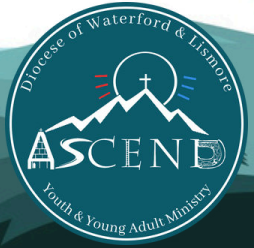

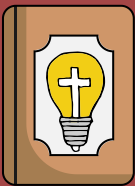

This Gospel passage tells the familiar story of the Sermon on the Plain (or in Matthew's Gospel, the Mount), or part of it anyway, the part we refer to as the Beatitudes.

If Jesus was running a modern day marketing campaign for the Church, people would think He was crazy! Happy are the meek, the persecuted, those who mourn, those who hunger... really? That just doesn't make sense, or at least not by the world's standards.

Jesus knows our happiness cannot be based on the circumstances we find ourselves in, or our achievements or power or wealth: all these things are fickle and fleeting.

True joy is based on the sure knowledge that we are created and loved by God, and no matter what life may throw at us, from bad weather, difficult exams, strained friendships, match losses, breakups, sickness and even death, we know that nothing can separate us from the love of Christ.

United with Him, with our eyes fixed firmly on Him, we can choose joy in any circumstance.

Our ultimate goal can't be earthly happiness: our ultimate goal is heaven, and any losses or inconveniences or suffering we may have to go through on our way there will pale into insignificance against the glory and never-ending joy of Heaven!

Reflect on the scripture quote and allow thoughts and images that come to you to form part of your doodle prayer: it could be people or situations that need prayer or even areas you might need to change in. 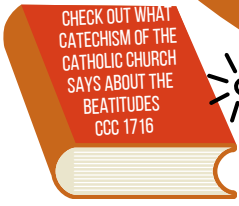
RESPOND!

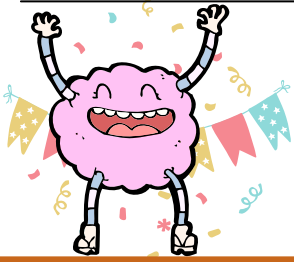
