MAS PIER GIORGIO FRASSATI?





READ THE SHORT BIOGRAPHY OF PIER GIORGIO FRASSATI OR WATCH THE VIDEO HERE FROM FRASSATI USA:



Pier Giorgio Frassati was born in Turin, Italy on 6th April 1901 to wealthy and influential parents, Alfredo Frassati, the owner and director of one of the largest and most liberal Italian newspapers, La Stampa, and Adelaide Ametis, a painter. His sister Luciana, who was to become his best friend, was born 17 months later.

Pier Giorgio's faith did not stem from his immediate family's witness. His father was agnostic and his mother was not deeply religious. She attended Mass but worried when her son went to daily Mass as she was afraid he would want to become a priest. Both parents were strong characters and the Frassati home was often filled with tension and arguments as the couple moved steadily closer towards a divorce, something which pained their children greatly. Their son did all that he could to keep them united and maintain peace in the home.

From a young age, Pier Giorgio had a deep interest in serving others. Once when a poor lady came to the door with her barefoot child in her arms, little Pier Giorgio didn't hesitate to take off his own shoes and socks there and then for the little boy to wear, before gently closing the door so no-one in his family would know what he had done. He had an acute sensitivity to the suffering of those around him and did all that he could to help others. From the little allowance that his father gave him to pay for first class train tickets, he chose to ride third class, or forego the train ride altogether and walk instead, so that he could give the money to the poor and sick. Italy was struggling greatly from the ill effects of World War I and poverty, sickness and social inequality was rampant.

Pier Giorgio initially struggled at school, compared to his naturally academic sister but studied hard. At the age of ten his father moved him to a Jesuit run school, which was a real source of joy for Pier Giorgio as the sincere faith of the priests deepened his own faith too. Pier Giorgio displayed an incredible love for Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, and would often be found alone, spending the night on his knees in the church in adoration. He loved Our Lady deeply too, would bring flowers to his beloved Madonna of Oropa.

He prayed the rosary daily, seeing his rosary beads as a weapon for spiritual warfare. He would often encourage his friends to pray the rosary with him, or attend Mass at 5am before going mountain climbing or skiing together in the Alps. His friends nicknamed themselves "The Shady Characters" or "The Sinister Ones" and Pier Giorgio himself, "The Wild One". He was a prankster, full of laughter, but also a loyal and steadfast friend. He always stood up for what was right, whether it was a fellow student being bullied or later when college professors ridiculed the Catholic faith or taught immoral philosophies. His joyful and calm attitude was evident to all who met him, as well as his deep convictions and love of the Truth.






Pier Giorgio was passionate about sport and the great outdoors in particular. He loved running, canoeing, skiing, hiking, riding bikes, rowing, horse-riding, playing pool smoking cigars and mountain climbing. "Verso l'alto" (which means "To the Heights"), a motto which has become associated with Pier Giorgio, was one he wrote on a photo of him on the last mountain he climbed. He read poetry, especially Dante; he loved music and theatre and frequented bars. He sang loudly and sometimes out of tune. He laughed heartily. He believed life was to be lived to the fullest; he never wanted to simply exist but to really *live*. The higher he climbed, the closer he felt to God. It was undoubtedly in the silence of nature and his time in front of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament that Pier Giorgio felt that his call to serve the poor was revealed to him.

Pier Giorgio was convinced that charity alone was not enough, but social reform was needed and so was involved in groups like the Society of St Vincent de Paul, and political movements at the time, especially those in opposition to Fascism. He studied Engineering with a strong desire to be a mining engineer so as to be of help to those working in the worst conditions in the mines. However, his father insisted he join him in the newspaper business at La Stampa. Pier Giorgio often put his family's happiness before his own: when he fell in love with a girl in his group of friends, Laura Hidalgo, he sacrificed telling her about his feelings because he knew it would probably cause even more friction in his own family. Shortly before he died, Pier Giorgio was offered the choice of a car or money for his graduation gift. He chose the money so that he could share it with the poor whom he felt it his honour to serve. "All around the sick and all around the poor I see a special light which we do not have."

In 1925, Pier Giorgio contracted a virulent form of poliomyelitis through his contact with the sick and poor, but said nothing to his family as they were preoccupied by his grandmother's serious illness. Growing steadily weaker, the last note Pier Giorgio wrote was instructions for helping friends of his who were poor and sick. When he died in 1925 after a short but severe illness lasting just a week, thousands lined the streets for his funeral. His parents were shocked as they had never known their son's true heart for charity and service amongst the poor and marginalised of the city of Turin. His inspiration eventually led to his father rediscovering the Catholic faith and his parents' marriage being strengthened.

Miraculously, his body was found to be incorrupt when his coffin was opened during his beatification process in 1981. Pier Giorgio was beatified by St John Paul II in the year 2000, who called him "A Man of the Beatitudes" and "the man of our century", and was named Patron Saint of World Youth Days. He was canonised by Pope Leo XIV along with his fellow Italian, Carlo Acutis, born 90 years after him, on 7th September 2025 in Rome.

- True happiness does not consist in the pleasures of this world, or in earthly things, but in peace of conscience, which we only have if we are pure of heart and mind.
- Jesus is with me. I have nothing to fear.
- The times we are going through are difficult because cruel persecution of the Church is raging. But you bold and good young people should not be afraid of this small thing; remember that the Church is a divine institution and cannot come to an end. She will last till the end of the world. Not even the gates of hell can prevail against her.
- In prayer the soul rises above life's sadnesses.
- Nothing is more beautiful than love. Indeed, faith and hope will end when we die, whereas love, that is, charity, will last for eternity; if anything, I think it will be even more alive in the next life!
- In a world gone astray from God there is no peace, but it also lacks charity, which is true and perfect love.
- Every day that passes, I fall more desperately in love with the mountains... I am ever more determined to climb the mountains, to scale the mighty peaks, to feel that pure joy which can only be felt in the mountains.
 - With every day that passes, I grow more and more convinced how ugly the world is, of how much suffering there is, and, unfortunately, of how it is the good who suffer the most. Meanwhile, we who have been given so many of God's blessings have repaid Him poorly. This is an awful reality that racks my brain; while I'm studying, every so often I ask myself: will I continue on the right path? Will I have the strength to persevere all the way? In the face of this pang of doubt, the faith given to me in Baptism reassures me of this: by yourself, you will accomplish nothing, but if you place God at the centre of all your actions, then you will reach the goal.
 - *In God's marvelous plan, Divine Providence often uses the tiniest twigs to do good works.*
 - To live without faith, without a heritage to defend, without battling constantly for truth, is not living but existing; we must never exist but live.
 - Our Lady is worth a whole lot to the church, and we owe everything to her.



Pier Giorgio was in many ways an ordinary young man who loved sport, music, being with his friends, playing pranks and being outdoors. However, he had an extraordinary passion for his faith, for social justice and for caring for others. He used what little wealth he had personally, along with his time and his joyful attitude to bring consolation and help to those most in need. He lived out his Christian faith everyday, and chose not to give in to sadness or bitterness.

- LIVE SIMPLY! Pier Giorgio came from a wealthy family but lived simply! Have you collected too much clutter? Give something away this week that you don't need!
- JOYFUL WITNESS: Pier Giorgio was known for his good humour and deep sense of joy. Can you try to be like him in your family and circle of friends?
- SOCIAL MEDIA: Pier Giorgio is a great role model for youth. Why not share a video or quote from him on your social media so others can learn about him?
- DEVOTION TO MARY: When he was 17, Pier Giorgio consecrated himself to Our Lady. You could do the same thing use this short prayer every day: Mother, I am yours now and forever. Through you and with you, I want to belong always and completely to Jesus. Amen.
- SERVE OTHERS: Pier Giorgio gave everything he could, including his time to the poor and sick, out of love for others and not for recognition. Is there some way you can help those less fortunate than yourself?
- FAMILY: Pier Giorgio's life at home wasn't easy. He was frequently misunderstood and criticised, but he did all he could to bring peace and unity into his home. How can you be an agent for peace in your own home?



- HOBBIES: Pier Giorgio loved going to the theatre, to operas and museums. Schedule an outing with your friends to a play or a good movie! Why not go all Italian on it and make it a movie and pizza night?
- ART DISPLAY: Design some flyers or posters to promote the story of Pier Giorgio in your school / youth group / church. See if you can create some appropriate hashtags for his biography and example, and share QR codes for short videos on his life!



 SPOTIFY: Create and share a Spotify list of tunes that you think share the message of Pier Giorgio's life and attitude in some way. Pick one song and explain the reasons you chose to include it on the list.



 REFLECT: take one of the Pier Giorgio's quotes and keep it somewhere safe to reflect on in the days ahead. Ask Pier Giorgio for his help in living the best life you can live.



FAITH LIFE 1: Pier Giorgio's life was not always easy but he leaned on Christ as a friend, and always made it to Mass each day, as well as spending some time in front of the tabernacle in the Church praying. Why not take 5 minutes out of your day to sit quietly in your local church and ask God to bless your life, your family and your friends? Or just talk to Him like a friend, the same way Pier Giorgio did?

- FAITH LIFE 2: Pier Giorgio also had a great love for Our Lady and always had his rosary beads in his pocket and would bring flowers to the Our Lady of Oropa statue. Before you go to bed each night, try saying one decade of the rosary which takes about 2 minutes (an Our Father, ten Hail Marys and one Glory Be). Find an image of Our Lady that you love too!
 - BE INSPIRED! Pier Giorgio was himself really inspired by St Paul and carried a handwritten copy of St Paul's <u>Hymn to Charity</u> from 1 Corinthians 13with him everywhere. What saints inspire you? Are there any quotes of theirs that you can keep close to you?
 - JOURNAL EXERCISE: Pier Giorgio believed in living life to its fullest, not just merely existing. Pray this Prayer for Courage daily and journal any inspirations that come to you. "Heavenly Father, give me the courage to strive for the highest goals, to flee every temptation to be mediocre. Enable me to aspire to greatness, as Pier Giorgio did, and to open my heart with joy to Your call to holiness. Free me from the fear of failure. I want to be, Lord, firmly and forever united to You. Grant me the graces I ask You through Pier Giorgio's intercession, by the merits of Our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen."
- HIS CALL: Pier Giorgio discerned his call to serve the poor and marginalised through prayer and silence, both in the church and in nature. Try to spend time in silence, each day, allowing God to reveal your call to you!
- THE GREAT OUTDOORS: Pier Giorgio fell in love with the mountains more and more: why not go for a hike with your friends or family, and spend time noticing the glory of creation?



- Eye-witnesses do not always see the full events or details they might only have seen the start / end of the incident, or maybe just the aftermath. They may even only have heard something from someone else, rather than seeing it with their own eyes. They may not be totally reliable!



Bonus ideas:


- Watch a short news clip on YouTube to become familiar with the running order / type of language used.

- Go all out and wear costumes for the report!





On a photo of the last mountain he climbed before his death, Pier Giorgio wrote the words, "Verso l'alto!" (To the Heights). For Pier Giorgio, life was to be lived fully, and his attitude of always upwards wasn't just advice for ascending mountains, but for spiritual ascent too. The more we progress in our spiritual life, the clearer our ability to discern God's will and hear His voice.

That doesn't mean life was easy for him. Pier Giorgio was like any other young person who had to struggle with school, exams, family problems, the expectations of his parents, lapsed faith among family and friends, relationships, and unjust societal issues, as well as daily battling against his own will and passions too:

"To live without faith, without a heritage to defend, without battling constantly for truth, is not to live but to 'get along'; we must never just 'get along'."



In just 24 short years, Pier Giorgio lived his life to the full, cared deeply for those around him, especially the poor and marginalised, and achieved a level of virtue and sanctity that was truly inspirational. St John Paul II called him "the man for our century" because of his heroic virtue.



WHAT IS EUCHARISTIC ADORATION?

Eucharistic Adoration is one of the greatest gifts in the Catholic Faith: to be able to be with Jesus, truly present in the Blessed Sacrament. It doesn't necessarily mean that it's easy for us to do, however. Our brains and our hearts can have a difficult time with silence and stillness in today's world, so full of noise and distractions. And yet, it's what our heart craves the most: to be with the One who created us, loves us, knows us intimately and wants to give us all the graces we need! St Augustine once said, "You have made us for yourself O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in you."


What do I do during Adoration?

Just be! Adoration doesn't need to be complicated. It's not about what we do, or what we get out of it. It can absolutely help us grow in holiness, in knowledge of ourselves, in peace, joy and forgiveness. We can find real healing through Adoration, and a time to rest our weary hearts in Jesus' heart. The best part is, we don't actually have to **do** anything. We just have to **be present to Him** as He is present to us. We can gaze at Him in the small white host in the golden monstrance, or we can close our eyes. We don't have to overthink it, we just have to receive. If we struggle, we can ask Him to help us.

St Carlo Acutis once said, "When we get in front of the sun we get suntans. When we get in front of the Eucharist, we become saints." So, just allow His goodness, mercy and peace to flow over you like the rays of the sun!



What if I find it hard to concentrate?



Well, that means you're human! It's natural for us to get distracted. It can take some time for us to quieten our hearts and our minds. We're used to instant everything: notifications, gratification... whereas prayer, especially in the silence of a chapel, requires us stepping away from that, unplugging from the noise and distractions, physically setting aside our phones and handing that time over to God for whatever He wants to do with it. Sitting in silence and mulling over our worries without involving God in the conversation isn't prayer - it'll probably make you feel even worse - bring your problems to Him but don't dwell on them either.

Talking to God about your concerns, your joys, your hopes and dreams - and allowing Him space to respond to you, now that's prayer. And prayer changes us! If you get distracted, it's ok. Start small, maybe with 10 - 15 minutes of intentional time with the Lord, and build up a little each time you visit!

HOW CAN I SPEND MY TIME WELL?

There are lots of things you can do: you can use traditonal prayers or speak from your heart, you could pray a Rosary or a Chaplet of Divine Mercy, you could read and meditate on a passage from the Bible (particularly the Gospels), you could write in a prayer journal, you could read from the lives of the saints...



Fr Josh Johnson recommends the **Pirate's Prayer: ARRR** - **a**cknowledge, **r**elate, **r**eceive, **r**espond. Acknowledge that you are in the presence of the Lord. Relate with the Lord through your own life. Receive the blessings he is offering to you. Then respond by making some resolution to bring God into your life as you leave Adoration.



MAKE THE SIGN OF THE CROSS TO ENTER INTENTIONALLY INTO A TIME OF PRAYER

Slowly taking three deep breaths: as you breathe in and out, pray silently and slowly in your heart, "Come Holy Spirit.... Come Holy Spirit...."

TRY THE PIRATE PRAYER: ARRR



Thank the Lord for the gift of His Presence here. Thank Him for the gift of your life, and all the gifts that He have given to you. (Spend some time thanking the Lord for things / people you are grateful for in your life.)



Talk with the Lord about what's going on in your life right now. What are the challenges? What are the worries? What do you need His help and guidance with? Talk with him like you would talk with a close friend, knowing you don't have to pretend to be anyone other than who you are, or pretend to feel any way other than how you feel!



Spend some time in silence now, allowing the Lord to speak to your heart about your life. Ask Him for the blessings and graces you need. You might find it helpful to sit with you eyes closed and your hands open on your lap. Even if you can't feel it, know that the Lord is blessing you and working in your life right now.



Make a resolution of some kind before you leave Adoration - how will you make more room for the Lord in your life when you leave here? What one thing needs to change? What one action can you decide on, one habit to change, one virtue to practice? Ask the Lord for His help to do this; on our own we are weak, but nothing is impossible to God!

TRY JOURNALLING: A SIMPLE NOTEBOOK & PEN WILL DO!

You might find it helpful to journal with one of the following prompts:

- "Lord, I don't know how to do this or what I'm meant to be writing. Please help me...."
- "Lord, I'm struggling with and I really need your help..."
- "Lord, I'm finding it hard to understand.....and I need your clarity on this."
- "Lord, I'm so grateful for....."
- "Lord, I'm so worried about...."
- "Lord, what is it you want me to hear today?"
- "Lord, I really want to know why...."



TRY PRAYING WITH SCRIPTURE

- Quieten your heart and invite God in, notice His presence ("Come Holy Spirit" x3)
- Read a scripture passage slowly, several times (try something from the Gospels)
- Note which phrases / words stand out for you
- Notice your response: What emotions / memories / hopes / dreams / fears are rising in your heart?
- Listen for His response: Heart speaks to heart
- Journal your experience (a few words / sentences / paragraphs: write a letter to God? A note of encouragement for yourself? A Prayer for someone? A decision to act / speak? Commit to a change that needs to happen in your life?

TRY PRAYING THE ROSARY: (MEDITATE ON EACH MYSTERY / SCENE AS YOU PRAY)

Ask Our Lady to help you to pray and to pray for you!

Pier Giorgio Frassati loved to pray the rosary. Do you know how to pray the Rosary? Maybe you could start praying one decade every day? A decade only takes about two minutes!

HOW TO PRAY THE ROSARY

MAKE THE SIGN OF THE CROSS

Pray the Apostle's Creed: I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; He descended into hell; on the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there He will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the Communion of Saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

PRAY FOR THE POPE'S INTENTIONS: One Our Father, three Hail Mary's and a Glory Be.

DECIDE WHICH MYSTERIES YOU WILL BE MEDITATING ON.

Announce the mystery before each decade e.g. "The first Joyful Mystery, The Annunciation"

FOR EACH DECADE: Pray one Our Father, ten Hail Mary's and one Glory Be.

AFTER EACH DECADE: Pray the Fatima Prayer.



If I speak in the tongues of men or of angels, but do not have love, I am only a resounding gong or a clanging cymbal. If I have the gift of prophecy and can fathom all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have a faith that can move mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give all I possess to the poor and give over my body to hardship that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing.



Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It does not dishonour others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres. Love never fails.

But where there are prophecies, they will cease; where there are tongues, they will be stilled; where there is knowledge, it will pass away. For we know in part and we prophesy in part, but when completeness comes, what is in part disappears. When I was a child, I talked like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became a man, I put the ways of childhood behind me. For now we see only a reflection as in a mirror; then we shall see face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I am fully known.

And now these three remain: faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is love.

Jesus was challenged by the Scribes and the Pharisees in this passage because some of His disciples did not perform the Jewish ritual required to clean their hands to the elbow before eating. Jesus is critical of the Pharisees for putting human tradition above God's Law because the tradition of the elders, the teachings of the Pharisees, extended the ritual-purity laws of Temple worship to everyday Jewish life. Jesus criticizes the Pharisees for making this tradition equal to and as binding as the Law of Moses. Their priorities were all wrong. The Pharisees were more concerned about the superficial appearance of being religious, rather than actually striving for personal holiness and true obedience to God's will. Jesus often challenged them about this. He challenges us too.


We each have a choice to make: we can ignore what God calls us to in His Commandments, and the decisions we know He wants us to make, **or** we can really look into our hearts and see what needs to be rooted out to make room for Him there. Jesus is pretty blunt about those habits / sins in Mark 7:21-23 that are damaging to our souls, and those around us.

Fr Mike explains our two choices like this: We can say "here's why I'm the exception to that commandment" or we can say, "Thy will be done."

What kind of message do you think young people most need to hear today? What are their hearts looking for?

POPE FRANCIS: WYD 2016 MESSAGE TO YOUNG PEOPLE



Pope Francis spoke first about the fear we can feel of being paralysed: "thinking that ... there is no longer any room to grow, to dream, to create, to gaze at new horizons – in a word to live..."



"But in life there is another, even more dangerous, kind of paralysis... I like to describe it as the paralysis that comes from confusing happiness with a sofa. In other words, to think that in order to be happy all we need is a good sofa. A sofa that makes us feel comfortable, calm, safe. A sofa like one of those we have nowadays with a built-in massage unit to put us to sleep. A sofa that promises us hours of comfort so we can escape to the world of videogames and spend all kinds of time in front of a computer screen.

A sofa that keeps us safe from any kind of pain and fear. A sofa that allows us to stay home without needing to work at, or worry about, anything... That is probably the most harmful and insidious form of paralysis, since little by little, without even realizing it, we start to nod off, to grow drowsy and dull while others - perhaps more alert than we are, but not necessarily better - decide our future for us....

Dear young people, we didn't come into this world to "vegetate", to take it easy, to make our lives a comfortable sofa to fall asleep on. No, we came for another reason: to leave a mark. It is very sad to pass through life without leaving a mark. But when we opt for ease and convenience, for confusing happiness with consumption, then we end up paying a high price indeed: we lose our freedom.

This is itself a great form of paralysis, whenever we start thinking that happiness is the same as comfort and convenience. that being happy means going through life asleep or on tranquillizers, that the only way to be happy is to live in a haze. Certainly, drugs are bad, but there are plenty of other socially acceptable drugs, that can end up enslaving us just the same. One way or the other, they rob us of our greatest treasure: our freedom....



Jesus is not the Lord of comfort, security and ease. Following Jesus demands a good dose of courage, a readiness to trade in the sofa for a pair of walking shoes and to set out on new and uncharted paths. To blaze trails that open up new horizons capable of spreading joy, the joy that is born of God's love and wells up in your hearts with every act of mercy. To take the path of the "craziness" of our God, who teaches us to encounter him in the hungry, the thirsty, the naked, the sick, the friend in trouble, the prisoner, the refugee and the migrant, and our neighbours who feel abandoned. To take the path of our God, who encourages us to be politicians, thinkers, social activists. The God who asks us to devise an economy inspired by solidarity. In all the settings in which you find yourselves, God's love invites you bring the Good News, making of your own lives a gift to him and to others...

God expects something from you. God wants something from you. God hopes in you. God comes to break down all our fences. He comes to open the doors of our lives, our dreams, our ways of seeing things. God comes to break open everything that keeps you closed in. He is encouraging you to dream. He wants to make you see that, with you, the world can be different. For the fact is, unless you offer the best of yourselves, the world will never be different.


The times we live in do not call for young "couch potatoes" but for young people with shoes, or better, boots laced. It only takes players on the first string, and it has no room for bench-warmers. Today's world demands that you be a protagonist of history because life is always beautiful when we choose to live it fully, when we choose to leave a mark... He wants to turn your hands, my hands, our hands, into signs of reconciliation, of communion, of creation. He wants your hands to continue building the world of today. And he wants to build that world with you....




