A number of our young pilgrims supported the Prayer in the Square 24 Hours for the Lord event for the Jubilee Year, when along with Holy Family Mission we ran a special "Youth Hour" of Adoration – it did everyone's heart good to see the marquee filled with young faces and hear young voices lifted in prayer and song!

We had a group reunion in June at Holy Family Mission – beginning with Mass followed by games, a testimony from Kathi at HFM, lunch, a hike in the forest and finally a beautiful half hour of adoration in the chapel; it was so encouraging to hear our youth speak about how they are encouraging each other to grow in faith!

Nine of the thirteen young people volunteered as leaders for the Good News Faith Camp in Tramore in July (the others would have liked to, but work commitments got in the way!) and their enthusiasm, love and joy were a great witness to the children participating.

Some of the young people participated in the Creation Surf Camp and the Youth 2000 Summer Festival, further deepening their faith! We've seen great fruit from the 2024 and 2025 pilgrimages and are discerning and planning how to build on this in a continual way for the year ahead.

The second annual Pope John Paul II Award diocesan pilgrimage to Medjugorje took place on 3rd – 10th May 2025 with thirteen Pope John Paul II Award participants from Ardscoil na Mara, De La Salle and Coláiste Dún lascaigh, along with two teachers, Faith Rep leaders and Spiritual Directors Bishop Phonsie and Fr PJ Breen PP. Our young people were amazing – so full of fun, so easy to work with, so open to faith. All really enjoyed the week with many saying it was life-changing for them and have continued to volunteer in the diocese. We're looking forward to the 2026 Pilgrimage already!

FAITH REP UPDATES

Our Faith Rep programme is in its third year, and we are approaching the final training day for this year's candidates before commissioning. The feedback from the Faith Reps themselves has been very positive and they have gained a lot personally as well as content-wise from the training sessions and ongoing support. We are currently taking feedback from the Year 1 group who are deciding whether to stay on for another year or two as they have almost completed their two-year commitment. Post-Commissioning we have encouraged our Faith Reps to arrange meetings with the Parish Priest and Strategic Task Force to look at practical but small steps to get started. Every year these young adults are a joy to work with: their enthusiasm for mission and supporting the diocese is genuinely so uplifting! Let's keep these young faithful adults in our prayers as they continue to witness to their faith when they leave Holy Family Mission.

In August we ran the Interdiocesan Jubilee Frassati Camino for Young Adults along St Declan's Way, and ten wonderful young adults joined the team for four days of hiking, prayer, reflection, laughter and tending to sore muscles! It was a profound experience for the group, as the conversations, the prayer, the opportunities for silence as well as fellowship along the way opened their hearts to God and to new possibilities. Sincere thanks to our own Fr Shane O'Neill and Fr Vincent Stapleton (Cashel & Emly) who led the Camino so well, blending history and culture, prayer and meditation, fun, games and music! A highlight for many was our visit to St Declan's Well at Toor, a bit of a detour from our route: there we renewed our baptismal promises and had an opportunity for silent prayer and reconciliation. All the group said they would love to do this again next year, so we will see how the Lord leads us!

CALLED TO GREATNESS

THE POPE JOHN PAUL II AWARDS

This Autumn over 60 students from 6 schools will be receiving Pope John Paul II Awards, as well as 5 Papal Cross recipients, which is very exciting! Although not a school award, our schools are very helpful in facilitating the award. Conscious we never want the award to be a "tick-the-box" exercise, we are continually looking for ways to engage our participants in faith-based formation activities, foster links in their parishes, and find new friends in faith. It's encouraging to see how the Faith Rep model is linking with the awards in many areas, offering opportunities for adoration in the parish or in school, considering Alpha Youth as an option to support our young people. As with everything, more can always be done, but we find from reading the reflections the young people submit, the more welcome they feel in their parishes, the more the award means to them and the more they get involved. Sincere thanks to all in parishes who facilitate the award! It was also great to have our Papal Cross participants help at Jubilee events like "Songs of Hope" in the Cathedral.



Running since March 2022, Encounter is our Young Adult Outreach (18 - 35 year

olds) in the Waterford City region. Once a month we invite young adults to join us in St John's Church for a talk or testimony followed by a time of adoration and

DAY OF PRAYER AND REFLECTION FOR YOUTH & YOUNG ADULT MINISTRY IN MOUNT MELLERAY ABBEY



On Saturday 9th November we had a fantastic day with just under 50 in attendance: a mixture of young adults, priests, religious, prayer groups, people invested in youth ministry in various groups and movements, and Faith Reps. It was an uplifting day for all present, with lots of networking and a time of prayer for the intentions of all present and for our diocese.

The day was a local follow-on from "Into the Deep: Intentional Young Adult Ministry" Conference organised by the Bishop's Conference in June 2024. We had a very fruitful afternoon session using the Conversation in the Spirit model encouraged by the Synodal Process which led to some encouraging and hope-filled sharings on the questions: How can we walk intentionally with young people on their journey of faith and provide meaningful opportunities for them to encounter Jesus, and particularly, what is the Spirit prompting us to? It was especially encouraging to have so many young adults present, offering their experience and insights to those who are committed to youth & young adult ministry in different ways throughout the diocese. We look forward to running this event again!





July saw three Campa Mhuire Mháthair camps for children in the diocese again: Dungarvan, Tramore and Ardmore. It's great to see so many Faith Reps, Young Adults and Teens from around the diocese who engage with Ascend Youth & Young Adult Ministry volunteering at these camps, sharing their joy, their enthusiasm and their faith with our youngest generations through catechesis, drama, art, music, sport, adoration and Mass and simple times of prayer too! Watching them blossom as leaders in faith is very special and gives great hope for the future!





Each summer the Strategic Task Force for Youth & Young Adult Ministry pauses to review and evaluate our progress through our three-year plan. It's hard to believe that we are already two thirds of the way through and thankfully are making great progress! This year we hope to place a greater emphasis on running regular events for U18s, to provide ongoing formation and fellowship for those participating in the Pope John Paul II Awards in particular. We also plan to roll out a Carlo Acutis "Pilgrim Statue" programme to schools and parishes where possible, and further consolidate events like the REvive Conference, Medjugorje Pilgrimage, Prayer Spaces and Encounter events: there are a lot of other plans which you'll be hearing about in time!

As part of the Jubilee Year **PRAYER IN THE SQUARE**: 24 Hours for the Lord, Ascend Youth & Young Adult Ministry volunteered to run a youth hour, inviting both young people and those who wished to pray for young people, to gather from 6 - 7pm on Sunday 25th May led by youth from Holy Family Mission, our JP2 Pilgrimage to Medjugorje and youth leaders. It was a beautiful time of silent adoration mixed with music and prayer. We saw from our young people in Medjugorje that they loved Adoration, they loved the peace and the joy they experience through spending time with Jesus. Afterwards our teens and leaders gathered in McDonalds for some ice-cream treats – always welcome! Our Faith Reps in **TRAMORE** Parish have also successfully facilitated a beautiful **YOUTH ADORATION** initiative over the past number of months, with the young people always asking: "When is the next one?"







REVIVE CONFERENCE

In 2024 we brought back the Diocesan Transition Year RE Day at Mount Melleray. Little did we realise as we planned our 2025 day that Mount Melleray would be closed in January, but we had already decided to move our event to the fantastic facility at the SETU Arena in Waterford. We had a very successful first REvive Conference with TYs and 5th years from post-primary schools around the diocese, and they greatly enjoyed the input from Elma Walsh, as well as the games, music and workshops. Bishop Phonsie also brought with him the relic of Blessed Carlo Acutis on the day so it was lovely to have an opportunity to introduce them to the story of Carlo as well as the late Donal Walsh, in whose memory Elma founded the #LiveLife Foundation promoting a message of the preciousness of life.

Our next REvive Conference is planned for November 2025. It was great to have a number of our commissioned Faith Reps with us, as well as religious communities and Holy Family Mission to help run the conference and give great witness to faith at all stages of life and in all vocations – a fantastic example of the collaborative aspect of our strategic plan for youth and young adult ministry.



REVIVE HIKE & REFLECTION DAY

In April we ran, in collaboration with Holy Family Mission, a Reflection Day & Hike with over 60 Transition Year students from the Loreto Secondary School, Clonmel. The girls were great fun and participated well in the forest hike near Glencomeragh House, the reflection experience in the chapel, the craft activity, journalling time, games, hot chocolate and snacks. Katharina from HFM shared her impactful testimony of her struggle with self-esteem and fitting in until she she realised her true worth as a daughter of God. The weather was amazing and it proved to be a great model for a Retreat Day for a post-primary school, one which we hope to build on.

PRAYER SPACES TRAINING

The Pastoral Centre was utterly transformed on the 12th March for a day-long Prayer Spaces Experience with a training session that night led by Emma Thompson of Prayer Spaces in School, Ireland. We welcomed adults, families and post-primary students throughout the day, and enthusiastic parishioners that evening who were all very inspired by the simplicity and the depth of experience a Prayer Space can evoke. Not to be confused with Sacred Spaces, Prayer Spaces are a particular interactive, individually directed type of prayer experience whose tangible nature, calming atmosphere, thought-provoking questions or simple activities can reach people of all ages at a level they don't expect, to help create a moment of encounter with God. We were very pleased with how our Prayer Spaces event ran, the only complaint was that it should have run for longer so more people could come. With that in mind we're planning to hold the Prayer Spaces over two days this Autumn. If you have 3 minutes to spare, it's well worth watching our highlights video on the Diocesan YouTube channel to see the set up and the responses from some of those who attended the training session.



Throughout the year we have been working closely with Stephen Plunkett, Diocesan Safeguarding Director, on producing a resource guide for those who want to run U18 events in their parishes, with relevant checklists, relevant forms, templates and Risk Assessment guides. Having this for Faith Reps or anyone interested in U18 ministry takes the mystery and the fear out of these activities and is a great resource to build on going forwards.

RENEWAL DAY: SUPPORTING RE TEACHERS & CHAPLAINS



In October we supported our Diocesan Post-Primary RE Advisor, Olivia Elliott (also a member of the Strategic Task Force) in hosting our second **RE**newal Conference for Post-Primary RE Teachers, Chaplains and TY Coordinators at Glencomeragh House. Our third **RE**newal conference will be 16th October - a great way to build links with our schools!


