# Pray 🏈

In the Gospel today we hear Jesus challenge his listeners to reflect on what faith means and can do.

- What is the Holy Spirit saying to you through this piece of Scripture? How do these words resonate with you personally?
- Do you believe God can do great things *for* you, that He can work miracles *in* your own life?
- Do you believe that God can do great things *through* you in the lives of other people?
- Do you often fall into the temptation of working out of your own strength, rather than thanking God for His grace at work in your life?
- This week, pray especially to have the grace to serve God as and when He calls you.

Lord, make me an instrument of your peace: where there is hatred, let me sow love; where there is injury, pardon; where there is doubt, faith; where there is despair, hope; where there is darkness, light; where there is sadness, joy.

# Talk

In today's readings we hear Jesus's parable teaching us about the link between faith and service.

- Have you ever won a medal or a prize for something? What does it feel like to be praised and celebrated?
- Have you ever done a random act of kindness for someone *secretly* what did that feel like?
- What kind of things does each member of the family do that make a big difference to someone else in the family? Spend some time thinking about all the little ways you serve each other.
- Jesus wants us to help build up the Kingdom of God - one way we can do that is to serve others and not look for praise or reward: it's not easy, but through His grace we can do it!

# Family Challenge!



Make a commitment as a family to performing Random Acts of Kindness for others in your family, or at work, or at school. Try to perform these kindnesses or little acts of service to others in a secret manner, so you don't receive praise for them! It's between you and God!:)

#### JUST A LITTLE FAITH

In today's Gospel we hear Jesus teach about faith and service to God. The context is a continuing dialogue between Jesus and his followers about what it means to be a disciple of lesus.

Jesus has just finished an instruction on sin and forgiveness. There are two related teachings that lesus offers to his disciples when they cry out for an increase in faith. The first is the familiar reminder that faith, even just a little, will enable the followers of Jesus to do wondrous things.

But this uplifting and inspiring teaching is quickly followed by the second teaching, a caution about knowing one's place in God's plans. The disciples of Jesus are to understand themselves as servants to God and his plans. Even when God works wonders through us, with our mustard seedsized faith, we must not seek praise.

Our participation in God's plans is God's grace to us nothing more, nothing less. When we are graced enough to cooperate with God, the work we do is nothing more than our obligation to God as faithful stewards.

And yet, our faith enables us to believe that what we have offered in service to God, as his servants, can be made to produce a hundredfold. Loyola Press Sunday Connection

The lives of the saints teach us so much about faith, humility and service. A few weeks ago, we learned about Padre Pio's incredible humility and obedience, and how he gave his all to God, ministering to others for up to 19 hours a day and always putting God and those who came to him before his own needs.

This week we can focus on the little Italian saint, Francis of Assisi. Francis was born to a wealthy, noble life, but an experience with Jesus Christ changed his heart and all he wanted from that point on was to serve God and others. He literally gave away all his wealth, his security and possessions and trusted in God to provide for his every need. His joy, his faith and his radical commitment to the gospel were exactly was what needed at a time in Church history where wealth and power had begun to corrupt the church from within. God's troubadour and his inspiring life and witness helped to rebuild the Church and remind people what a life of service can look like.
